

XKR-S Media Day at the Hotel Del Coronado

t all started with a call from the San Diego Union Tribune's Mark Maynard. He said Jaguar USA was holding an event at the Hotel Del Coronado for the media the next day to promote the new XKR-S. Though the event was intended for the press only, he felt no one would mind if a Jaguar enthusiast wandered in. That was enough impetus for me. The following morning, I met Dan Jensen in the lobby of the Hotel Del, and off we went to crash the party.

Mark was right, not only were the Jaguar folks not annoyed with our arrival, they welcomed us with open arms. And while the media was being briefed, we were able to walk around, take pictures and chat with the good people of Jaguar USA. We learned that the day's event was for the US media, with reporters from all over the US attending. The following day was to be for the Chinese media, then the German and so on.

There were six XKR-Ss in the lot, one each coupe and convertible in Italian Racing Red, Polaris White, and French Racing Blue. In pairs, members of the press were to drive the cars to El Centro where they would get to drive out on the an air strip and see what those bad boys could do. Mark was teamed up with Dave Stall (the Car Guy on KUSI). Mark emailed me from El Centro later that day and said this, "The car is stellar at high speed. Steering response is phenomenal; light force but quick ratio. And the exhaust note is animal!"Lucky stiff.



About the XKR-S; it is a performance version of the XKR which is a performance version of the XK which is a performance car in and of itself. In other words, it is an XKR on steroids. It wrings another 40 hp out of the XKR's supercharged engine for a total of 550! It can go 0 - 60 in 4.2 seconds with a top speed of 186 mph (perfect for commuting) making this the fastest Jaguar ever built. Jaguar will only build 500 total over the next three years; 300 coupes, 200 convertibles. This year they built

100 coupes and 25 convertibles. The coupes are already sold out. There may be a few more convertibles available but not to worry, the 2013 allocation goes on sale on the fall. The price tag is around \$138,000 for the coupe and somewhat higher for the convertible (remember, if the top goes down, the price goes up).

Dan and I had a great day. The reps from Jaguar USA welcomed us as Club members and were extremely hospitable. Mark Maynard gave me his Jaguar media cap and Dave Stall is excited about doing something about our Club on KUSI.

Black - All ground connections

Green - Ignition circuit, additional switches or fused

Black/ Green - Relay to radiator fan motor

Green/ Black - Fuel gauge to fuel tank unit

Blue - Headlamp connections

Green/ Blue - Water temperature gauge to temperature sender unit

Blue - Headlamp switch to dimmer switch

Green/ Red - Direction indicator switch to left-hand flasher lamps

Blue White - Headlight high beams

Green/ Purple - Stop lamp switch to stop lamps

Blue/ White - High beam dimmer switch to indicator lamp

Green White - Direction indicator switch to right hand flasher lamps

Blue/ White - Dimmer switch to long-range driving light switch

Green/ Yellow - Heater switch to heater motor

Blue/ Red - Headlight low beams

Light green/ Blue - Flasher switch to left-hand flasher warning light

Brown - Main feed from the battery. No switches or fuses

Light green/ Brown - Flasher switch to flasher unit Brown/Yellow - GEN to volt. regulator

Light green/ Purple - Flasher unit to flasher warning light

Brown/ Blue - power feed to headlamp switch

Purple - Accessories fed direct from battery via fuse

Brown/ White - Ammeter to main alternator terminal

Purple/ Brown - Horn fuse to horn relay when horn is fused separately

Brown Yellow - Long-range driving light switch to lamp

Purple Red - Switches to map light, under bonnet light, glove box light and boot lamp when fed direct from battery fuse

Brown/ Yellow - Alternator to 'no charge' warning light

Red - Tail lights, instrument lights and side markers Brown/ Purple - Alternator regulator feed

Red/ Yellow - Fog light switch to fog light or fog light fuse to fog lights

Brown/ Green - Fuse to horn (No relay)

Red/ Blue - Front fog light fuse to fog light switch

Brown/ Black - Horn to horn button (no relay)

Red/ White - Fuse to instrument lamp switch, Instrument panel lamps

Yellow - Generator connections wired through the ignition switch

White - Ignition circuit, no additional switches, not fused



Jaguar gains traction in China

If there's anything felt strongly in Coventry these days, it's continued pride at the continued success of the city's most famous automobile: Jaguar. Indeed, reports now suggest that the 76-year-old marque, which has its largest market in the UK, is doing even better in China.

According to Chinese media, Jaguar Land Rover (JLR) sold 42,063 vehicles in China last year, reflecting a 61% increase over 2010. Of that total, sales of Jaguars in China rose 123% year on year to 5,976 units, including 945 units in December alone.

Analyst IHS Global Insight last August reported that sales of Jaguar cars in China are led by the E1-class Jaguar XF sedan [see photograph], which accounted for 28.9% of sales in 2010. By 2015, IHS Automotive forecasts Jaguar sales to increase by more than 200%, based on 2010 data.

Meanwhile, Bob Grace, Director of Operations in China, said JLR expects to see further strides this year. Last November, Grace said that the firm will open a new training academy in western China early this year, following the two existing academies in Beijing and Shanghai.

"In China the key thing we have been working on over the course of the last 16 months since we took control of distribution here was really getting closer to customers," Grace said.

This is a man who knows what he's talking about, too.

Hailing from Coventry, heartland of the UK's automotive industry, the 49-year-old Grace has worked for JLR since 1985 in both domestic and overseas markets. More to the point, he helped develop JLR's China strategy in the UK.

But Grace was not content to remain in the rear, choosing instead to relocate his wife and five children from the UK in order to be a part of the burgeoning market to be found in today's China.

"It's just too big and too positive an opportunity to not want to be a part of," Grace told Chinese media. "In 10 years' time, our company will look back at this period as being a major turning point in our history."

Local production is one of the key strategies in JLR's development plan for China, but it has yet to find a local partner. "We are engaged in discussions with a number of partners," Grace said last year.

"I am guite confident that in the foreseeable future, subject to approvals, we will have a world-class manufacturing facility here in China building our latest vehicles," Grace said.



But there is no doubt about Grace's enthusiasm or convictions concerning China: "Building cars in China for the Chinese consumer to the highest quality standards is our absolute goal."

Meanwhile, Grace said that the company will continue to introduce new Land Rover products to the mainland market, and will introduce Jaquars with lowerdisplacement engines to meet the requirements of the Chinese market.

Underscoring that policy, at Auto Shanghai 2011 the company presented what one writer called "a stunning line-up of models" including the world premiere of the Jaguar XJ 3.0, a luxury business sedan specifically developed for China.

That's called creating traction.



2011 was a great year for the San Diego Jaguar Club. Along with all the extraordinary events we held, several of our members did quite well in the JCNA sanctioned Concours competitions. Six SDJC members placed in the North American Standings and five more placed in Regional.

Remember, in order to qualify to win a North American award, you must enter your Jag in at least three competitions in the same class in the same year at any JCNA sanctioned event. North America includes the US, Canada and Mexico. Regional winners are required to compete in at least two competitions in their region in a year. Our Southwest Region includes California, Arizona, New Mexico, Nevada, Utah, and Colorado.

Scoring is accomplished as follows: Champion Division scores are based on 100 being a perfect Jaguar, just like it came out of the factory. Driven Division scores are base on 10 points being perfect with some slight modifications to the car being allowed understanding they may be driven to work daily. Champion Division and Driven Division are judged to the same standards except that in Driven Division the engine, trunk, tools, and manuals are not judged.

We had one Jag, an E-Type in Preservation Class (19A). Preservation Class is a class within the Champion Division. In this case, the car must be unrestored or near original, over 20 years old, well prepared, and in good to excellent condition.
