

The more Jaguars, the better! All Jaguar owners are encouraged to bring their cars for positioning in the show area where entrants and spectators may view and admire them. Display Division cars may be eligible for informal awards.

Directions to SDJC Concours

Spanish Landing is on the south side of Harbor Drive directly across from the Terminal 2 exit from San Diego International Airport (Lindbergh Field). From I-5, follow the signs to the Airport. This will place you westbound on Harbor Drive. Go past the Terminal 1 and Harbor Drive traffic signals and watch for the Spanish Landing signs. Turn left into the park at the traffic signal for the exit from Terminal 2. There will be San Diego Jaguar Club Signs and balloons marking the location.



The San Diego Jaguar Club plans this as a show and a picnic. If you are traveling from out of town and cannot pack a picnic lunch, box lunches, soft drinks and water will be available for purchase on site for a nominal fee. Lunches must be reserved on the registration form so that we have sufficient numbers on hand for sale.

Overnight motor home and trailer parking is not allowed in Spanish Landing Park. There are county, state, and privately operated parks that accommodate overnight stays. One such is De Anza Harbor Resort at 2727 De Anza Rd., about seven miles from Spanish Landing (619-273-3211). There is often space past the west end of the Concours field that can accommodate day-of-show trailer and tow vehicle parking. If available, space is allotted on a first-come, first-served basis.

All entrants are requested to bring a fire extinguisher.

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

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INTRODUCTION

From the moment of their introduction the 2.4 litre and 3.4 litre Jaguar saloons scored such instantaneous successes and created such a world-wide demand that a doubling of the Company's output became necessary. Even so, demand still exceeds the supply, a situation which, so far from inducing complacency, has spurred the Company to further efforts in effecting improvements to cars already of outstanding design and performance. Is Jaguar going green?

Green is all the rage these days, and I don't mean British Racing Green. Nope, we're talking environmental friendliness, and Jaguar Land Rover is moving with the times, both in its headquarters and just possibly its new Ftype, too.

In mid-June, Jaguar Land Rover won a major award for directing its business toward an environmentally friendly future, winning the Climate Change category at the 'Big Tick' Awards, sponsored by the British charity, Business in the Community.

Jaguar was recognized for its innovative approach to carbon management, having adopted a three-strand approach to tackling climate change, reducing tailpipe emissions, reducing operational emissions and carbon offsetting.

Not least, Jaguar management plans to spend £9 million to improve efficiency, and offset a total of 5.2 million metric tons of carbon. Oh, yes, all JLR cars are now designed to be 85% recyclable and 95% recoverable.

Meanwhile, Jaguar and other British automobile manufacturers have urged the government to do more to promote the idea of using "green" cars among the general public.

Their concerns were raised at a hearing of Parliament's Commons Transport Committee, which was holding an inquiry into the future of low carbon vehicles.

MPs heard evidence from Nigel Berkeley, director of the Applied Research Centre in Sustainable Regeneration at Coventry University, who had been part of a £25 million trial of low carbon technology.

The Government-funded project, called CABLED, involved Coventry, Aston and Birmingham universities, engineers Arup, Coventry and Birmingham City Councils, utility e.on, and vehicle manufacturers Mitsubishi, Tata, LTI, Smart, Microcab and Jaguar Land Rover.

Berkeley said that manufacturers were willing to produce electric vehicles, and the quality of the cars themselves had increased, but that the general public remained reluctant to buy them.

Asked whether Government predictions that "tens of thousands" of electric cars would be on the road by 2015 were realistic, Berkeley said it was a very optimistic figure given "the current level" of demand. "There is a huge problem that although the willingness is there from the industry, and the technology is there, consumer demand is still lagging way behind," he said.

Electric and other low-emission vehicles were being promoted as a solution to environmental problems but motorists chose which cars to buy based on the quality of the vehicle, he said.

"The Government could do more to stimulate demand particularly in terms of public awareness and education around what electric cars can do for drivers. There's too much emphasis on electric vehicles as a solution for the planet's ills while the evidence is that they are actually decent cars as well," he said.

Jaguar's plans for green cars – which are certainly a lot more than just "decent" – were unveiled in May 2011 when the firm said it would build a \$1.2 million 200 mph hybrid supercar, which can run on both gasoline and electricity.



That's hardly a mass production item, but the Jaguar F-type has been revealed as the production version of the C-X16 concept car. The F-type will be built as a convertible, with much of the C-X16's exterior and interior design said to be unchanged.

But here's the rub for green enthusiasts: although the C-X16 concept featured a hybrid powertrain, the F-type is likely to be powered by a conventional V6 gasoline engine, with the option of a manual gearbox.

"We're totally committed to performance hybrid technology, but the F-type won't necessarily have the same powertrain as the concept. We'll start with a non-hybrid at launch," Jaguar's global brand director, Adrian Hallmark, told What Car? Magazine.
