## **Presidential Perspective**

While Jorgene and I were on a long-weekend getaway to Borrego Springs, I came down with what I thought was a cold, a fairly rare occurrence for me. However, after returning to San Diego, it became apparent that it was more than a cold, so I trotted off to Urgent Care to get more serious medications than vitamin C and aspirin. The new meds seemed to help a bit, but my recovery was taking far longer than I was used to. As a result, I decided to take matters into my own hands and do something that I knew would help. I bought another Jaguar! Well, actually, "we" bought another Jaguar. Perhaps a little background is in order.

We have been giving thought to replacing our 2004 XJR over the past few months. I had been on the lookout for an XF, in part because of its somewhat smaller size than the XJR, and we had driven several examples to get a feel for the car. We test drove a 2013 a couple of months ago that was for sale at a local non-Jaquar dealer, but we didn't feel motivated enough to make a counteroffer to their asking price. Then we recently received a call from the salesman saying the price had been reduced \$4000 and asking if we were still interested. We thought, "Hmmm, let's go drive it again." I even went so far as to throw my checkbook into the car. However, as I was parking our car in the dealership visitor parking lot and Jorgene was opening the doors of the XF for another look at the interior, a salesman came over hurriedly and told her the car had just been sold. In these types of instances, we just assume it is "Divine Intervention" and move on. Since we were primed to look at cars, we decided to swing by Jaguar San Diego and look at an XF they had for sale. Upon arrival, Josh Bott, the Assistant Sales Manager, told us the XF was not available for a test drive at the time. So I, innocently, asked "What else have you got for sale?" He pointed to the Jaquar we were standing beside and said, "How about this XJ?" I had never considered the newer, X351 body-style XJ so I again went "Hmmm". Then, fatefully, Jorgene opened the passenger door, sat down, and said two words: "Burl" (lots of it) and "Luxury" (even more). A few days later, after calls/e-mails with Josh, who is the consummate Jaguar representative, we were the proud owners of our eighth Jaguar, a Claret Red XJ. To close the deal, Jorgene gave both Josh and Richard Farler, Jaguar San Diego General Manager, one of her famous bear hugs. I think they are both still trying to catch their breaths! Overall, this was probably the most memorable of our Jaguar purchases.

One of the joys of buying another Jaguar is that it gives us a reason to recall our excitement when we bought our other Jags. We can recall the search, the first look, the first drive, the pride of new ownership, and, yes, the sadness when the time came to part with them. I am sure many of you can recall similar experiences as well.

## International Jaguar Festival

The First Annual International Jaguar Festival (IJF) was held at the Scottsdale Plaza Resort in upscale Scottsdale Arizona, Sunday through Tuesday, April 3 – 5, immediately following the JCNA Annual General Meeting (AGM) that was held Thursday through Saturday, March 31 – April 2, at the same resort. The annual IJF event replaces the Western States semi-annual event. The AGM and IJF were hosted by the Jaguar Club of Central Arizona (JCCA), commonly known as the Phoenix Jaguar Club.





<u>Saturday Afternoon</u>: Hotel and registration check-in for the IJF started, slightly overlapping the end of the AGM. Surprisingly, they closed the IJF registration table at 6:00 pm, sending away anyone who arrived after that time, telling them to come back in the morning, as they were too busy with other things to check in anyone else.

<u>Sunday Morning</u>: The Concours d'Elegance was held on the resort grounds. Those who could not check in Saturday were checked in when they arrived that morning. The Concours itself was well organized and the cars were lined up in several side courtyards and in the central courtyard, grouped by car model. A special area out front of the hotel was designated as the "Timeline" area, displaying cars from Jaguar's earliest days to the newest F-Types.



The Concours went smoothly from this participant's perspective, and one reason is that our own Dick Cavicke, who is also the JCNA Chief Judge, was this Concours' Chief Judge. The JCCA's Chief Judge quit the club recently, leaving the club and the event in a lurch without a chief judge. Dick stepped up at a moment's notice so the Concours could be held. Dick was assisted by our own Chief Judge, Paul Novak. Between the two of them, the Concours judging started and ended on time and there did not seem to be any glitches from a participant's point of view.

San Diego participants included Tom Krefetz, who brought his 1963 E-Type and 2016 F-Type (what a contrast); Craig Venter, who brought his '48 Mk V and 1966 XJ-13; Paul & Debby Novak, who brought their 1990

V-12 VDP; Colin Seid, who brought his '35 SS1; Kurt Astroth, who brought his 1974 XJ-6; Diana & I who brought our 2009 XF; and Marco De La Barrera (Jaguar Club of Mexico) brought his 1952 XK-120.

<u>Sunday Evening</u>: There was a backyard-type BBQ dinner (hot dogs, hamburgers, fixin's, and sides) in an outdoor tent on the hotel grounds. After dinner, we watched the 1973 movie *Harold & Maude*, a dark comedy about a young man obsessed with death. As some of you know, the movie has a tie-in to Jaguar in that the main character, Harold, converted an E-type into a Hearse about half-way into the movie. The guest speaker before the movie was the designer and builder of the converted E-Type in the movie.

Monday Morning: It's Rally Day. Eighteen cars entered the Rally and another 20 or so drove the route on a non-timed tour. The Rally seemed less than optimally organized, as procedural information was scarce and no one checked our start time, sending us out on the road whenever. I couldn't figure out how they timed the cars between all the checkpoints if they didn't know when each car started out. One checkpoint was on a 50 MPH two-lane, undivided highway. Some drivers couldn't slow down enough for the checkpoint worker to see the small number on their windshield or headlamp because they didn't want to get rear-ended due to heavy traffic on the high-speed roadway, so they didn't get credit for going through said checkpoint. In spite of these shortcomings, the 80-mile drive through the Sonora Desert was beautiful and we ended up at Barrett Lake for lunch on the restaurant patio. The convoluted checkpoints were the topic of conversation at several tables during lunch. Tom Krefetz, owner of Classic Showcase, sponsored the lunch, which was delicious. The Rally started up again after lunch and we drove 30 miles back to the hotel, taking a much more direct route. Interestingly, there was no one at the finish line to check our arrival time. I still don't know how they figured out who had the closest time to the established time for the route if they only checked between two or three checkpoints and not at the start and finish.

Monday Evening: We were bused to the Western Heritage Museum for a tour and a catered western BBQ buffet dinner. The museum was filled with paintings, photographs, and all sorts of memorabilia from the Old West. Some took the hour-long, docent-led tour, while others chose the self-guided tour. Dinner was served immediately after the tours. The pulled pork, tri-tip, honey-soaked biscuits, coleslaw, and mac & cheese were delicious. It was some of the best BBQ I have ever eaten. We toured some more after dinner and then boarded our buses for the ride back to the hotel.

Tuesday Morning: The Slalom was held in the back parking lot of Mesa Community College, about 10 miles from the hotel. The slalom ran much more smoothly than the Rally. Eleven cars entered the Slalom. I was the only participant from San Diego, but Nedra Rummell and Paul & Debby Novak cheered me on as spectators. Each driver got five runs, with the best run time being the one that counts. My first run was a little slow as I got to know the track, but each of my subsequent runs were faster than the previous one. I knocked 4 seconds off my first run time with my fifth run, but was still 3 seconds off my best run time back in 2012. No one crashed and the event finished an hour ahead of time. The only disaster was early on when the driver of an F-Type took a shortcut at the finish line and ran over the timing sensor, bending it. The Crew Chief bent it back into shape in just a few minutes and the event resumed.

<u>Tuesday Evening</u>: The formal plated awards banquet was held in one of the resort ballrooms. My filet mignon was perfect, as was Diana's

chicken. The San Diego contingent sat at two tables and the conversation was as good as the food, if not better. The guest speaker was Mike Dale, former president of Jaguar USA and of JCNA. He spoke for about 45 minutes, telling us all about Jaguar USA in the 1970's and 1980's. When he finished, it was time for the awards presentations. Everyone from San Diego who entered won either a first place or second place trophy, as did those from the Inland Empire Jaguar Club, the Jaguar Owners Club of Los Angeles, and the Jaguar Club of Mexico.

<u>Wednesday Morning</u>: Time to leave the heat of the Sonora Desert and take the 6-hour drive back to San Diego, where it was 15° cooler and not nearly as dry. Okay, our drive was closer to 5 hours, but I didn't want to say so in case the traffic police were reading this.

One thing I learned about putting on an event like this was that no matter how much preparation you make, if you don't communicate with your participants or execute well, it can leave a sour taste in someone's mouth. However, all in all, the trip and the festival was an enjoyable and satisfying experience.

## Paul and Debby Novak's "Miles Ahead" Hollywood Adventure by Paul Novak

On Monday, 1 December 2014, I received an email from Charlie Hallums of the Jaguar Owners Club of Los Angles (JOCLA) that forwarded the following request from the Transportation Coordinator of a film studio in Culver City, CA:

"I'm looking for a 1986 XJ6 British Green [Jaguar] with saddle interior for a film shoot staring Don Cheadle. If you or any of your members are interested in renting for our shoot, we will pay \$450.00 for the day. We will provide our own insurance.

#### Thank you."

Due to their proximity to Hollywood, JOCLA is regularly asked to provide specific Jaguars for TV shows, movies, and other events. JOCLA forwards these requests to others, especially if they know someone who has the kind of Jaguar requested. I have seen these requests before and I have been waiting for a chance to do this, so here was my chance for fame and fortune. Charlie knew that one of my Jaguars matched the request, so he forwarded the email directly to me. I replied by email to the Transportation Coordinator and attached exterior and interior pictures of my Jaguar Racing Green 1990 V12 Vanden Plas, a Jaguar that looks nearly identical to the Jaguar requested except that it has the Jaguar V12 engine and badging instead of the six-cylinder engine and badging found on the XJ6. I figured that the engine type probably wouldn't make a difference to them, and I was right. Don Cheadle, the star (he plays Miles Davis) and Director of the now-released movie "Mile Ahead", about jazz musician Miles Davis, was shown the pictures of my Jaguar and he decided it was exactly what he needed. I received two emails the following day:

"Thank you for responding. They love the car. Still waiting on a date. We will shoot this at our stages located in [Culver City, CA]"

followed shortly by:

"We will need the car at 1:30 pm [Friday 5 December]. We will shoot till around 5:00 pm. I'll be sending a copy of our insurance for your records. "

Fortunately for Debby and me, we had both recently retired, so complying with this request was an easy thing for us to do. We drove up to LA that Friday morning and were present during the set up and filming of a short scene where Miles Davis is shot while sitting in the front passenger seat of a friend's Jaguar. We arrived for the filming around noon, received a tour of the stage where the filming would take place, met Director/Actor Don Cheadle (of House of Lies and Iron Man fame) and were present during the entire setup and filming of this very short but important scene. We were treated very nicely the entire time, were fed at a catered dinner, enjoyed tours of the sets of "House of Lies" and my 1990 V12 Vanden Plas received lots of love and attention all day long from the stage crew. I spent a lot of time answering questions about my Jaguar and it received many compliments including from Don Cheadle.

The first photo below shows my Jaguar inside the sound stage with the sound, lighting and camera crew all around it as it was being prepared for the filming. The next two photos show close ups of the camera in place to catch the crucial seconds where Miles Davis (played by a stunt man and not Don Cheadle for this scene) gets shot in the left hip while sitting in the front passenger seat. They used small explosive squibs for the sound of the gunfire and physical impact to the hip (hence the stunt man), but they didn't use anything to simulate the blood for fear of damaging the interior of my Jaguar (their concern as well as mine).

Director Don Cheadle was specifically interested in using the same kind of Jaguar with the same exterior and interior colors that they used in the summer of 2014 while filming "Miles Ahead" in Cincinnati. That Jaguar (and not mine) is seen throughout the movie driving around in the city and in the movie posters. When they started editing the film in the fall, they realized that they needed some additional close up footage of Miles Davis getting shot in the left hip. Because the colors of my Jaguar matched the Jaguar XJ6 that they previously used in Cincinnati, this worked out nicely for them as well as me. I was close to my Jaguar during most of the day and everyone was very careful of it at all times including during the setup, filming and removal of the camera, sound and lighting equipment. It was a fun day for Debby and me, and I was very glad to be able to help them out (and take home the check for \$450).

My online research showed that Miles Davis was shot in 1969 in front of a Brooklyn, NY night club, but the Series III XJ6/12 Jaguars like mine weren't produced until 1979. So there is no way that Miles Davis was ever shot in Jaguar that looked like mine, but that is what they filmed. Hey it's Hollywood!!

#### Flash Forward 16 Months!

Debby and I went to the movies on Friday night 15 April to see "Miles Ahead". The movie opened in San Diego on 14 April. The last two photos show Debby and me at the theatre waiting to see the movie, and the electronic "Miles Ahead" poster inside the theatre for the movie. My Jaguar was only used for the very short (1 second?) sequence in the movie where Miles Davis, played by a stunt man and not Director/Actor Don Cheadle, gets shot in the hip following a car chase. That scene is actually shown twice in the movie, once at the very beginning and another time near the end. Both times it happened so fast that I could barely make it out and I turned to Debby and said "I think that was it!"

Debby and I were glad that we saw the movie, especially because my Jaguar was used in the filming. This was a special night for us, even though we had to wait over 16 months to see the movie. The posters prominently show Miles Davis (played by Don Cheadle) at the right front door of a Series III XJ saloon, and there were many other scenes in the movie showing the Series III XJ6 in Cincinnati being driven around during the day and night in the city.

I can't say that I really enjoyed the movie (other than the Series III XJ saloon pictures). Miles Davis lived a troubled and difficult life and suffered from alcohol and drug addictions as well as health issues. The movie used a lot of flashbacks that jumped around in time so that I found some partsof the movie hard to follow. But if you are a Miles Davis fan, are interested in seeing something new and thought provoking, or if you really like Series III XJ saloons like I do, you might find "Miles Ahead" to your liking. I don't believe it will win any Oscars, but perhaps Don Cheadle deserves a nomination for his portrayal of the troubled and talented jazz musician Miles Davis. If you go to see it, you can always brag at the concession counter that you know someone who owned one of the Jaguars used in making the movie. That just might get you some free popcorn. <Grin>

My name does not show up in the movie credits, but some of the nice people that Debby and I met that day (including Director/Actor Don Cheadle) were listed.



#### **CONCOURS GUIDANCE FOR THE ENTRANT**

- 1. All cars will be judged in accordance with current JCNA rules.
- 2. Ensure that your "Entrant Data" appears correctly on your score sheets. In order to compete for JCNA regional or North American standings you must be a JCNA member at the time of showing. Your name and JCNA Member Number, entered on the score sheet, must appear the same as on your JCNA Membership Card.
- 3. The vehicle Entrant or a member of his or her immediate family or trust:
  - a. Must be present during judging and is responsible for showing the car.
  - b. Will be given the opportunity to provide proof of authenticity for any items noted by the judging team for non-authentic point deductions.
  - c. Must initial those non-authentic deductions, which stand.
- 4. The component judging method will be used. When the judges arrive at your car, please have the boot lid, doors, windows and bonnet CLOSED and the soft top ERECT (removable hardtops are not judged in JCNA Concours). If appropriate for your car model, side curtains, tonneaus and boot covers should be displayed nearby.
- 5. Factory and/or aftermarket floor/overmats should be removed in order for the Judge to examine the basic carpeting. Factory fitted overmats will be judged; optional and aftermarket overmats will NOT be judged.
- 6. Judges are NOT permitted to touch the car without the Entrant's permission. Entrants will please open and/or close the windows, doors, bonnet and boot lid if and when requested.
- 7. Spare tires need not be removed for judging. However, Champion Division Entrants should be prepared to remove fabric tire covers for the Boot Judge to inspect the spare tire and wheel and, if necessary, to move the tire in order for the Judge to examine any tools that may be stowed behind it. The tools may be moved for display in advance. Metal tire covers on exterior spares need NOT be removed.
- 8. Driven Division entries will NOT have their boot nor engine compartments inspected; however, the judging team will require that bonnets be opened to verify that the cars have proper Jaguar engines.
- 9. Judging teams will make every effort to spend the JCNA-mandated maximum of 15 minutes actually judging each car, plus an additional 5 minutes for Operation Verification. ENTRANTS WILL PLEASE AVOID EXTRANEOUS CONVERSATION WITH THE JUDGES.
- 10. Following Operation Verification, Entrants are allowed 15 minutes to attempt to correct any light or horn malfunctions. If a repair is accomplished, within the allotted 15 minute period, the Entrant should contact the Judging Team leader in order for the item to be re-verified and the deduction adjusted if warranted.
- 11. Entries may not exit the display area prior to the end of the Concours without the permission of the Chief Judge or Concours Chairperson. Early departure is cause for disqualification. If an early departure is approved, a safety escort must be provided.


