We have been visiting the Zoo and San Diego Safari Park on alternate years for a number of years now, with each event including a unique, behind-the-scenes tour of zoo operations. These have been arranged by club member Ray Waite who has close connections with the zoo. The club took the opportunity to present the zoo with a check for \$1600 from SDJC-member contributions. 



Getting to Know...Keiichi and Junko Yamamoto By Keiichi Yamamoto



A bit about us...

Notes from the Concours Judges' Tent

This month, we'll focus on upcoming events for our judging team. Hats off to Mark Hodges, our Concours Chairman, for doing the many tasks it takes to make our event happen!

Now during the cooler, wetter days here in SDGO, I ask our wonderful, enthusiastic and professional team of 17 certified judges to make the most of your down-time to spare a bit of effort away from TLC of your Jaguars to review the basics of our "JCNA Concours d'Elegance and Judges' Rule Book" (2016 edition, for the moment). Although the AGM in March will consider some evolutionary changes to the higher architecture of the concours judging system, there is no anticipation of significant changes to the underlying philosophy or criteria of how we do our tasks on concours day (Saturday, 15 July 2017). I ask you to refresh your familiarity with JCNA Rule Book chapters III (Judging Ethics) and VI (Non-Authenticity scoring), as well as the JCNA Judging Guides for the jewels of your expertise, in particular. This will help you when we do the recertification testing in May and June. I've already heard from a couple of Judges in RSVP for the first 201 training session of 13 May.

<u>2017 Concours Judges Training.</u> Preparations have begun for our Saturday July 15th Concours being held at Spanish Landing Park. Provided below is a summary of the three types of Concours related training I will offer this year. Please RSVP to me at least 3 days before any class you plan to attend so there will be plenty of refreshments and training materials available.

- •Concours 101. A classroom presentation, show and tell, and informal discussion of JCNA concours for those unfamiliar with concours but interested in learning about it. No experience is required; you only need an interest in learning more about JCNA concours. One weekend session is planned on May 13th beginning at 1:30 PM in the San Diego Auto Museum training room. The session will last about 90 minutes.
- •Concours 201 (Optional). A session to get Apprentice Judges and Judges whose certification has expired up to speed so that they can participate as Certified Judges at our 2017 Concours. Experience as an Apprentice Judge or former JCNA certified Judge is required. Hands on judging of Jaguars using official score sheets, JCNA Concours Rule Books and JCNA Judge's Guides will be emphasized. One weekend session is optional, depending on your feedback for interest in this event. I'll welcome timely input until May 13th by email or phone.

Concours 301. The formal annual Judges Refresher Training required each year by JCNA to recertify Judges for the current concours year includes a classroom presentation, a review of the more important aspects of the JCNA Concours Rule Book, and discussions of the Rule Book changes for 2017. I plan to highlight the outcome of significant initiatives addressed at the 17-19 March 2017 AGM and their potential impact on our activities. The written 2017 Judges Test will be administered. Everyone is welcome to attend. This is an excellent way for Judges and Entrants to learn more about JCNA Concours Rules. Two weekend sessions are planned: Session 1 on May 13th at the San Diego Auto Museum beginning at 9 AM, and session 2 on Saturday June 17th beginning at 9 AM at Classic Showcase in Oceanside. Each session normally lasts about 3 hours.

Steering Boot Replacement Example in an E-Type by Tom Wright, SDJC Clubmember

When you turn the steering wheel of your Jaguar, the ram moves the tie rods to aim the front wheels in the desired direction. A rubber bellows a couple of inches in diameter and about six inches long called a boot is attached to the ram at one end and the tie rod at the other. The boots prevents dirt from getting into the ram ends and damaging it. If you take a peek at your front suspension this boot is the easiest part to identify and having spotted it you will know where the ram is (inboard end of the boot) and which of the parts is the tie rod (outboard end of the boot). You may also see that your boot is torn, perhaps even all the way into two pieces.



If either boot is torn, generally both should be replaced. If one goes, the other usually does too soon after. Fortunately, they are not that difficult to replace. There are no special tools needed, just a couple of wrenches and a screwdriver (or optionally a nut driver). The boot kit should contain the boot and two clamps.

Check to see if you should buy two kits or if a single kit contains two boots and four clamps.



These steps apply directly to an E-Type, but generally apply to many Jaguar models.

- 1. This job is most easily done with a two post lift. A four post lift is next best, but the job can be done even by just jacking up the front of the car and securing it with jack stands. You want the front wheels off the ground so you can aim them in different directions as you work.
- 2. Following the tie rod from the boot to the wheel, you will find the toe-in adjuster which is attached to a bracket with a ball joint at the top that in turn attaches to the arm that steers the wheel. Loosen the lock



nut on the tie rod a half turn.

3. Remove the nut from the bottom of the ball joint bracket and lift it out of the steering arm on the wheel



assembly.

- 4. When loosening the nut, the bracket may try to thwart you by turning in its fitting. Pull down on the tie rod to supply some friction. (In extreme cases it may be necessary to cut a grove in the bottom of the fitting with a Moto tool so a screwdriver can be used to keep it from turning while removing the nut.) If the bracket won't lift from the steering arm, put the nut back on for a couple of turns so you can hit it to loosen it and not damage the threads.
- 5. IMPORTANT: COUNT THE TURNS WHILE REMOVING THE TOE-IN ADJUSTER. That way you will be able to put it back just as it was and preserve the front end alignment of your car.
- 6. Remove the locking nut.
- 7. Remove the old boot. The inboard clamp may designed such that it is destroyed during removal; hence the clamps in your kit. You are now ready for the new boot.



- 8. It can be a bit of a struggle to get the inboard end of the boot onto the ram. I found it helpful on my E-Type to use grease on the inside of the edge of the boot and to temporarily unbolt the horn and let it hand on its wire to get it out of the way. Depending on details of the clamp, a nut driver may make installing the clamp easier. (A nut driver is like a screw driver but with a hole for a nut rather than a blade.)
- 9. Non-standard variation: rather than a clamp on the outboard end of the boot, I used zip tie so the end can slide in and out a bit when steering from lock to lock.
- 10. There are no special tricks for reassembly. Assembly is the reverse of disassembly. Of course you should use the number of turns you noted when reinstalling the toe-in adjuster.



Then repeat it all on the other side. When the new boots are in place, the ram will be protected from road grime.

A Jaguar repair shop will charge approximately 1½ hours labor to do this job. It will take you longer, but you will have a feeling of accomplishment and save yourself some cash.


