On that note, let's get our polishing rags and vacuums out and get ready for a busy spring in our Jags! Dan





Directions

From the West: Take the 5 freeway to Highway 78 and go east, exiting at Emerald Avenue. Notes from the Concours Judges' Tent

This month. we'll focus on some results of the JCNA Annual General Meeting (AGM) 18 March pertinent to concours judging. These comments are summarized for the sake of brevity. Be sure to read the full text when available. CR-14, NB-1.1:

To resolve the problem of a plethora of 100 point ties at the concours end of year (EOY) for several classes, an intensive study of the 'two-tier' proposal proposed at the 2016 AGM led to adoption this year of a more workable change to Chapter 2, section 1 of the Concours Rule Book. One thing that has changed is the thought that the International Jaguar Festival (IJF) carry a bit more weight than a regular club show. A detailed example was reviewed at the AGM. In short, the more eyes on the car, the better the assessment. The resulting change was adopted, effective in 2017:

B.1 – North American (NA) Awards

After each JCNA Concours year, JCNA presents the NA Concours awards, 3 deep in each of Champion, Special and Driven Division classes, to the members of the JCNA Affiliates or JCNA Members-at-Large. These annual awards are determined by averaging the Entrant's 3 highest scores during the Concours year. Entries competed in 3 or more JCNA Concours events automatically become eligible for an NA award in their particular Division and Class. If an Entry's 3 highest score average does not position it among the top three places of its class, then the Entrant's highest 2 scores will be evaluated for a Regional award per Section 2.

B.1.a – First Place Tie Scores

Should a first-place tie occur in any class in the Champion division, for the EOY NA Awards, the first place tie will be resolved by the total scores of all the JCNA sanctioned Concours events in which the entrants have competed that year. Scores achieved at the IJF qualify for inclusion in the 3 score year summary and will be entered twice into the computations in the event of a first place tie in the EOY placements. First place award will be given to the highest total of all the scores from JCNA Concours competition. Second place is the next highest and third place is the third highest. Ties are not affected in second and third place.

B.2 – Regional Awards (no change)

Regional awards are presented in each of the six JCNA Regions. These annual awards are determined by averaging the Entrant's 2 highest scores achieved in JCNA sanctioned Concours within the Entrant's home region during the Concours year. Scores achieved at the JCNA IJF qualify for inclusion in the 2 score average.

CR-15: Concours Committee Report Highlights

- The need for additional judging guides remains an issue to support consistent quality judging across the membership. Documentation of authenticity of the newest models needs to be captured through factory channels via JCNA on behalf of the affiliates.
- Concern that all clubs consistently train and enjoin their judges to apply the judging rules correctly and equally remains an issue. (See CR-14 above.)

CR-16: Judge's Concours Rules Committee Report highlights

- Once certified, Judges are expected to avail themselves to help with judging whenever needed. (There is no longer a required annual minimum).
- Miscellaneous administrative Rule Book edits and score sheet format corrections were approved.
- Chapter V, Section C. Exterior. Clear Bras are approved for Driven Division only (AGM 2016), and then, only forward of the "A" post. Other locations, and on anywhere on Champion Division Vehicles are considered non-authentic. Flaws on, and beneath these protective coatings are subject to cleanliness and condition (and authenticity, if beneath) deductions.

2017 Concours Judges Training.

- <u>Concours 101.</u> A classroom presentation, show and tell, and informal discussion of JCNA concours for those unfamiliar with concours but interested in learning about it. No experience is required; you only need an interest in learning more about JCNA concours. One weekend session is planned on May 13th beginning at 1:30 PM in the San Diego Auto Museum training room. The session will last about 90 minutes.
- <u>Concours 201 (Optional)</u>. A session to get Apprentice Judges and Judges whose certification has expired up to speed so that they can participate as Certified Judges at our 2017 Concours. Experience as an Apprentice Judge or former JCNA certified Judge is required. Hands on judging of Jaguars using official score sheets, JCNA Concours Rule Books and JCNA Judge's Guides will be emphasized. **One weekend session is optional, depending on your feedback for interest in this event.** I'll welcome timely input until May 13th by email or phone.

<u>Concours 301.</u> The formal annual Judges Refresher Training required each year by JCNA to recertify Judges for the current concours year includes a classroom presentation, a review of the more important aspects of the JCNA Concours Rule Book, and discussions of the Rule Book changes for 2017. The written 2017 Judges Test will be administered. Everyone is welcome to attend. This is an excellent way for Judges and Entrants to learn more about JCNA Concours Rules. Two weekend sessions are planned: Session 1 on May 13th at the San Diego Auto Museum beginning at 9 AM, and session 2 on Saturday June 17th beginning at 9 AM at Classic Showcase in Oceanside. Each session normally lasts about 3 hours. **Please RSVP to me at least 3 days before any class that you plan to attend so that there will be plenty of refreshments and training materials available.**

DIRECTIONS TO THE CONCOURS

The Concours d'Elegance will be held at Spanish Landing Park, which is located at 4500 Harbor Drive. Spanish Landing Park is on the south side of Harbor Drive, across from the Terminal 2 exit of San Diego International Airport (Lindbergh Field).

From I-5 North to Harbor Drive:

Exit Hawthorne St; follow the curve to go west on Hawthorne. Stay in the middle lane. Turn right on N Harbor Drive when Hawthorne ends and follow the road past the airport.

From I-5 South to Harbor Drive:

Exit Kettner Street; drive south on Kettner to Laurel Street. Turn right on Laurel Street. Stay in the right lane, which becomes Harbor Drive. Follow the road past the airport.

On Harbor Drive, Driving Past the Airport:

Stay in the left lane past Terminal 1 and Terminal 2. Watch for the Spanish Landing Park signs. Turn left into the park at the traffic signal for the exit from Terminal 2. The San Diego Jaguar Club feather will be near the parking lot entrance.



CONCOURS PARKING AND FOOD

Parking:

Day use parking is available in the public parking lot at the entrance to the park, or in any public parking lot. Please obey all rules concerning parking completely in the stalls, meters, and meter time limits.

Parking for towing vehicles and trailers is available across Harbor Drive in the long term parking lot or Liberty Station. Please obey all rules and fees concerning parking in these lots.

Parking out of stall or on the grass is specifically prohibited by port district rules. Only car show vehicles are allowed to park on the grass, and then, only in the area designated by the parking crew or Concours Chairman. Towing vehicles and trailers are specifically prohibited from parking on the grass per our permit (this is a change from years past).

We suggest you arrive early if using the parking lot as it fills rather quickly. Overnight parking of any kind is not allowed on Port District Property, including Spanish Landing Park.

Food:

The San Diego Jaguar Club plans this social event as a car show and picnic. Bring your favorite picnic items and food to enjoy your day at the bay.

Since there are not any restaurants within walking distance of the park, we have two lunch options available onsite.

- 1. Pre-ordered box lunches from a local deli. The deli will provide a sandwich, condiments, a chosen side, and a cookie. These box lunches will be delivered to the Concours Hospitality Tent between 11 am and noon.
 - a. If you wish a box lunch, be sure to pre-order yours via the registration form and order form available on the club website.
- 2. Delish Dogs, a gourmet hot dog and sausage vendor, will be onsite to prepare made-to-order food. Pre-ordering here is not required.

Hospitality Tent:

Complimentary coffee and donuts will be available until they run out. Water will be available for purchase for \$1 a bottle.

CONCOURS GUIDANCE FOR THE ENTRANT

1. All cars will be judged in accordance with current JCNA rules.

2. Ensure that your "Entrant Data" appears correctly on your score sheets. In order to compete for JCNA regional or North American standings you must be a JCNA member at the time of showing. Your name and JCNA Member Number, entered on the score sheet, must appear the same as on your JCNA Membership Card.

3. The vehicle Entrant or a member of his or her immediate family or trust:

a. Must be present during judging and is responsible for showing the car.

b. Will be given the opportunity to provide proof of authenticity for any items noted by the judging team for non-authentic point deductions.

c. Must initial those non-authentic deductions, which stand.

4. The component judging method will be used. When the judges arrive at your car, please have the boot lid, doors, windows and bonnet CLOSED and the soft top ERECT (removable hardtops are not judged in JCNA Concours). If appropriate for your car model, side curtains, tonneaus and boot covers should be displayed nearby.

5. Factory and/or aftermarket floor/overmats shall be removed in order for the Judge to examine the basic carpeting. Factory fitted overmats will be judged; optional and aftermarket overmats will NOT be judged.

6. Judges are NOT permitted to touch the car without the Entrant's permission. Entrants will please open and/or close the windows, doors, bonnet and boot lid if and when requested.

7. Spare tires need not be removed for judging. However, Champion Division Entrants should be prepared to remove fabric tire covers for the Boot Judge to inspect the spare tire and wheel and, if necessary, to move the tire in order for the Judge to examine any tools that may be stowed behind it. The tools may be moved for display in advance. Metal tire covers on exterior spares need NOT be removed.

8. Driven Division entries will NOT have their boot nor engine compartments inspected; however, the judging team will require that bonnets be opened to verify the cars have proper Jaguar engines.

9. Judging teams will make every effort to spend the JCNA-mandated maximum of 15 minutes actually judging each car, plus an additional 5 minutes for Operation Verification. ENTRANTS WILL PLEASE AVOID EXTRANEOUS CONVERSATION WITH THE JUDGES.

10. Following Operation Verification, Entrants are allowed 15 minutes to attempt to correct any light or horn malfunctions. If a repair is accomplished within the allotted 15 minute period, the Entrant should contact the Judging Team leader in order for the item to be re-verified and the deduction adjusted if warranted.

11. Entries may not exit the display area prior to the end of the Concours without the permission of the Chief Judge or Concours Chairperson. Early departure is cause for disqualification. If an early departure is approved, a safety escort will be provided.





Jaguar Tracks Article Submitted by Pete Rieth Heidi Hetzer Around the World Source: https://heidi-around-the-world.com/about/ dated 2 March 2017

This article is not about Jaguars. However it <u>is</u> about something that holds meaning for all of us in SDJC: What it means to be a real automotive enthusiast.

Heidi Hetzer is a 79-year-old former automobile dealer, rally car driver, classic car collector and popular celebrity in Berlin, Germany. She has just completed circumnavigating the globe, often solo, in a vintage car. She started in July 2014 in Berlin, driving a 1930 Hudson named "Hudo". Heidi more or less followed in the tracks of a notable German lady, Clärenore Stinnes who made a similar journey from 1927 to 1929.

Heidi's travels have taken her through Eastern Europe, Central Asia, China, South Asia, Australia and New Zealand. The voyage continued through the USA and Canada, where Heidi lost a finger in an accident while working under the car [SDJC Contributor's note: As we all should know – NEVER get your digits, hair, or anything else near an engine's exterior moving parts}. In Miami in December 2015, Heidi was treated for cancer. Luckily she was able to continue her journey (on a ship through the Panama Canal) from Lima, Peru in February of this year. She continued through Bolivia to Argentina and Chile (where vintage car enthusiasts helped get Hudo running again after his breakdown), then to Buenos Aires to ship Hudo to Cape Town for a tour around Southern Africa beginning in August 2016. Heidi triumphantly returned to Berlin on March 12th, 2017 by way of Suez Canal, Spain and France.
