

Presidential Perspective

As is often the case with clubs and volunteer organizations, Boards of Directors discuss ways to retain and expand their membership. It is no different with SDJC. This topic came up at the September Board meeting, which prompted me to recap why Jorgene and I are members of the club. We purchased our first Jaguar in 1984, a 1981 XJ6 in Grosvenor Brown (metallic cinnamon to me) with 40K miles. We kept the car for 15 years and added 110K miles to odometer. It was a good car, with the key attributes of grace and space, but lacking in pace by today's standards. We bought our second Jaguar in 1991, a 1984 XJS in Silver Sand Metallic with 98K miles. We drove this car for almost 20 years and added 69K miles to the odometer.

As you might imagine, being built following the dark days of British Leyland ownership of Jaguar, these cars had many issues over the years of our ownership. Since I had always enjoyed working on cars, I continued to do so with these (and most of our later Jags). However, obtaining reliable advice and documentation at the time was not easy. There was no Internet with the numerous Jaguar forums that now exist, and manuals were sketchy at best for a "shade-tree" mechanic. It was this dearth of information that prompted us to join SDJC in March 1996. I immediately tapped into the technical expertise of club members, which proved invaluable as the cars aged and needed evermore care and maintenance. I have no doubt that these cars would have gone to Jaguar heaven or another owner long before they did without the benefit of club membership. I attended numerous tech sessions in early years of membership, but as newer Jags, and all other cars, have become more complex and difficult to maintain without advanced diagnostic tools, these have pretty much disappeared. However, there is still a font of experience and advice available from SDJC club members that can be tapped, if only to help guide the work of our chosen Jaguar repair shops.

There are many other reasons for being a member of SDJC, the most important for us being the camaraderie that we have developed over the years. One need only attend a few events to get a sense of community that we share as owners of Jaguars.

The next club event is the British Car Day at Spanish Landing East on Sunday, October 8. I reviewed the various car clubs that comprise the British Car Club Council that sponsor the event: Austin Healey, Bentley, DeLorean, Jaguar, Jensen, Land Rover, MG, Minis, Rolls Royce, and Triumph. Oddly, I didn't see Aston Martin. As we know, many of these marques are no longer manufactured. Of those that remain, I would argue that Jaguar/Land Rover has thrived the most, and Jaguar easily has the most diverse offerings, leading edge technologies, and involvement in racing, both vintage and electric Formula E. In fact, I just read the headline of an article that appeared September 12: "Jaguar is starting an all-electric SUV racing series. It will run as a support series for Formula E". This is yet another indication of how far forward Jaguar is leaning to stay ahead of the pack as the automotive industry continues to undergo major transitions.

Enjoy the fall weather as you hopefully hit the back roads for a drive or two this fall.







Notes from the Judges Tent

This article provides information about the Jaguar Clubs of North America (JCNA) Concours d'Elegance Program to help you understand more about this aspect of Jaguar ownership. If you are a seasoned concours Entrant, I hope this will help you enjoy it more. If you have never participated, I hope this will encourage you to join in the fun.

2017 SDJC Concours Analysis: I provided a list of the provisional scores for the 31 judged Entries at our Concours in the August Jaguar Tracks. They are now FINAL. This month I took a deeper look at the Entrants, Entries, Judges and other facets of our Concours and came up with these interesting facts:

- There were 55 Entries registered for our July 15th Concours, 31 Judged Entries and 24 for Display.
- 1 judged Entry was disqualified (unable to present JDHT certificate as required for Preservation Class).
- There were 20 SDJC judged Entries (65%), 7 Jaguar Owners Club of LA Entries (23%), 2 Inland Empire Jaguar Club Entries (6%), 1 Jaguar Club of Central Arizona Entry (3%), and 1 Entry from the Jaguar Club of Mexico (3%).
- Of the 31 Entries that were judged, 16 were in Champion Division, 3 were in Special Division and 12 were in Driven Division.
- A 2014 F-Type was the newest Entry and a 1951 XK-120 was the oldest Entry, spanning 63 years.
- No Entries received perfect scores this year. Craig Wright's 1965 E-Type scored highest (99.95) in Champion Division. Dave & Jocelyn Kelley's (JOCLA) 1995 XJS convertible took highest Driven Division score (9.997). Ken and Glenda Roberts (JCCA) scored highest in Special Division with their 1967 E-Type 2+2 (9.98).
- There was one class with 5 Entries C5/E1 (1 was no show).
- There were two classes with 3 Entries, C14/XK and S2/MOD.
- There were seven classes with 2 Entries, C3/140, C9/XJ, C11/J8, C13/JS, D5/SLS, D10/K8, and D11/XK.
- There were seven classes with only 1 Entry, all receiving uncontested First Place Awards.
- Ten Entries received First Place awards while competing against others in their Class.
- Three received Second Place awards while competing against others in their Class.
- Three Entries received Third Place awards while competing against others in their Class.
- There were 24 Judges, 15 (+ 2 Apprentices) from SDJC (63%), 6 from Jaguar Owners Club of LA (JOCLA) (25%), 2 from Inland Empire Jaguar Club (IEJC) (8%) and 1 from Rocky Mountain Jaguar Club) (4%). For comparison, in 2015, we had more Judges from other clubs (55%) than SDJC (45%) at our Concours.
- There were no formal protests. There were 4 post-event score changes (Down from 8 the year prior).

Preparations are already in work for our 2018 Concours d'Elegance and we are looking for members interested in becoming Certified Concours Judges. San Diego Jaguar Club Board of Directors' Meeting Minutes – September 13, 2017

Meeting was called to order at Jaguar San Diego at 6:55 p.m. by President, Dan Jensen. The following Board members were present: Bob Proctor; Nedra Rummell; Dave Allen; Ali Proctor; Al Steele; Mark Hodges, Webmaster; Chuck Leuthen, Newsletter Editor. Absent: Tim Bennett; George Klein. Also present: Pete Reith, Chief Judge; Jim Hallameyer, Dealer Rep.; Dave Putnam, BCC Rep.; Pete Pickslay, Automotive Museum Rep.; Connie Noble, Mitch Cohen, Richard Lawler.

Secretary's Report: July 2017 Minutes were approved electronically.

Treasurer's Report: Dave – Membership dues are comparable with this time last year, while Zoo donations are significantly increased (up 40%). Logo wear income is significantly reduced this year (down 50.8%). This reduction in sales was noted last month and is expected since most of our items are purchased directly through the vendors via the website and do not go through our club accounts. Next month will see a small spike in logo expenses since Logo Tzarina Marie has ordered a few items from Lands' End in different sizes for samples. This should be a good service to members who want to examine sizes before ordering custom clothing.

This year's Concours had a net loss of \$728.00. This is remarkable considering the dealer sponsorship of \$1000.00 did not materialize. That's a great achievement by everyone!

Club dinners are shown as operating at a small profit (\$425.00) That is slightly misleading since it reflects the accounts at the end of August and does not include the Riverwalk income from checks or the final bill to the Riverwalk Golf Club. In fact, \$425 is approximately the excess of the PayPal income for the Riverwalk brunch received in August over the initial venue deposit. We are most likely operating at near neutral overall, which is another great achievement!

It is interesting to note that our net income for this year is ~\$6,500 and we have already paid a significant deposit for the Holiday Party. Comparisons with this time last year are difficult since we had not received the Port Authority security deposit at this time last year. It is clear though the expenses are under control and the Club is financially healthy.

Deposits are up to date with Tom Ham's Light House and Lou Tamagni (DJ) for the Holiday Party.

Overall the expenses are under control and the Club is financially healthy.
