Getting to Know.... Lynn and Mendi Wyatt

Lynn and I were born and raised in the Los Angeles, California area and also went to the same high school, Lynwood, graduating together, but we hardly knew one another.

Going or separate ways, Lynn joined the Airforce, followed by a job with Flying Tigers Airline, ending up working in Alaska. This is where he became a Bush Pilot and his stories are told in his new book "*Memories from My Logbook: A Bush Pilot's Story*". (<u>http://booklocker.com/9491</u>)

I went on to San Diego State College and majored in psychology. After graduation I worked for the next 10 years for the County of San Diego as a Social Worker and Social Work Supervisor. Needing a change from the pressures of my job, I took a break and helped a friend start up a construction company and stayed in the industry as an executive assistant until Lynn and I got together.

We met at our 25th High School Class Reunion, but it took another 5 years for us to get together. Lynn left Flying Tigers and moved to San Diego to work for Rohr Aerospace Industries in Chula Vista as an Engineer. We were transferred by Rohr right after our wedding in 1988 to Seoul, Korea where Lynn was an Airline Support Rep. A whole new experience for both of us! We lived in Seoul for 2 years, transferred to Bangkok, Thailand for 2 years, Saudi Arabia for 1 year, and Zurich, Switzerland for 2 years. Temporary assignments were also held in Singapore; Shanghai, China, with Visa renewal trips to the Philippines, Bali, Katmandu-Nepal; Hong Kong, London, and Bonn-Germany. All of the assignments afforded us the chance to join various International Groups and enjoy the experience of many new cultures and the gift of some very special friendships over the years.

Returning to the United States and San Diego in 1996, Lynn returned to his engineering job at Rohr/Goodrich Aerospace in Chula Vista and I worked at Children's Hospital with the Children's Specialists Group of Physicians as an Executive Assistant to the Medical Director and President until she retired in 2008 to pursue her hobbies of photography, quilting, decorating and golf.

Lynn also retired from Goodrich//United Technologies in 2008 becoming a Flight Instructor and Chief Pilot of San Diego Sport Flyers. He was called back to UTAS in 2009 and again retired in 2015. Since then, he was called back again in 6 months to support the Rolls Royce development engine at NASA Space center where he still works part time as a consulting engineer.

I have always loved Jaguars, especially the E Type (Who doesn't?) But my first Jag was a 2002 S-type which is still my daily driver. I also have a 1999 XK-8 Convertible which we have had fun entering in the SDJC Concours (It's not driven as much).

Lynn's daily driver is an FJ Cruiser or his GMC pickup, which has been in the family since 1988. He also has a BMW motorcycle and a 2007 Aston Martin, Vantage.

Lynn enjoys riding and working on his motorcycle, occasionally plays his classical guitar (after studying for 15 years) reads 2 to 3 books a week, and just published his first book. He also spends 1-2 hours 5 days a week at the gym (Use it or lose it!).

We feel that SDJC has allowed us to meet an amazing bunch of really nice people and attend fun events. We always enjoy getting together and socializing.


HAPPY HOLIDAYS to everyone and hearty congratulations to our newly elected Club Officers and Directors!


