

Where the Wild Things Are

A day at the World-Famous San Diego Wild Animal Park with the "World-Famous" San Diego Jaguar Club is always exciting from beginning to end. Gathering early (by some people's standards) at the entrance, members signed in with SD Safari Park volunteers, and then received their tickets and a map. That is where our adventure started.

We made our way, on our own, to the African Outpost to begin our private tram tour of the African Plains. This was a good test of our navigation and map-reading skills. Let's just say some members did better than others--but we all made it in time.

On the way we were fortunate enough to pass through the Lion Camp exhibit and see these majestic animals up close. The African tram ride was a nice way to spot the animals in a way that closely replicates their natural habitat. We learned how the SD Zoo helps to educate visitors and works to save species worldwide. We also learned that the Safari Park is an expansive wildlife sanctuary, home to more than 3,000 animals representing more than 300 species. Its renowned botanical collection represents 3,500 species and 1.75 million specimens. Over half of the Park's 1,800 acres have been set aside as protected native species habitat. We all enjoyed viewing such a wide variety of species, shot photos of our favorites (FYI - Bob's is the giraffe), and had a great time on the tram ride.

After the tram, we headed up to the Mombasa Pavilion for a private animal presentation and what an awesome presentation it was. Our first guest was a majestic Cheetah! We were all mesmerized by her beauty. She was truly breathtaking to behold. After viewing several of the other animal ambassadors, including Julius Squeezer, a 13-foot Burmese Python, we sat down to beautifully set tables and enjoyed an extensive buffet lunch. We then indulged in a seemingly endless supply of incredible dessert cakes.

No one left hungry. Not even one member who straggled in around 12:30pm you know who you are.







British Invasion

The Austin Healey Association of Southern California, along with the Jaguar Owners club of LA present the British Invasion

Join the British Invasion along the Harbor Walkway from 10 AM to 4 PM and enjoy a unique display of fine British motorcars including Austin-Healeys, Jaguars, Triumphs and others.

Austin-Healey is a British sports car maker established in 1952 through a joint venture between the Austin division of the British Motor Corporation (BMC) and the Donald Healey Motor Company (Healey), a renowned automotive engineering and design firm. It was the first affordable mass produced sports car that could go over 100 MPH. Classic Austin-Healeys, "Big Healeys", were produced from 1953 through 1967. The company also produced the Austin-Healey Sprite (1958 -69) and the Jensen-Healey (1972 -76). All of the Healeys were active in auto racing including European rallies, Le Mans, and Seibring. Most Austin Healeys were produced for the North American market, and California probably is the home to more Healeys today than any other state. For more, see http://www.austin-healey.org.

Jaguar is also the producer of classic British sports cars. Jaguar got its name by producing a series of successful eye-catching sports cars, the Jaguar XK120 (1948–54), Jaguar XK140 (1954-7), Jaguar XK150 (1957–61), and Jaguar E-Type (1961-75). The company is still producing cars today, more recently being owned by British Leyland, Ford and now by Tata Motors of India. Jaguar is synonymous with British racing prestige, dating back to Stirling Moss' 1950s heyday. Jaguar enjoyed great success at Le Mans in the 50s – totaling five wins in seven years. It moved into the Formula 1 mainstream when Ford bought Jackie Stewart's team in 1999, as Jaguar Racing's first Grand Prix came at Australian in 2000. Notes from the Judges Tent

Farewell to one of our longtime JCNA Judge Cadre members – Harvey Williamson

As noted in last month's journal, we lost a very talented member of our team in December. Harvey had been active for many years, not only in SDJC social, concours, and driving events, but also in numerous other classic auto clubs and in the evolution of San Diego County economy and society. Since almost a decade ago, Harvey had also been a major partner of the SDJC team providing judges in the annual Gran Concurso de Elegancia. This concours, sponsored by our JCNA partner Club Jaguar A.C. for over 30 years, takes place in March or April near Mexico City. The intense four-day event shares training and provides judges for dozens of



margues to award prizes for Best European, Best American, and Best of Show, and – of course, being sponsored by Club Jaguar – the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies in all recognized JCNA sanctioned classes competing in the current year. upper left and Club Jaguar Founder & President Enrique Vila Gil (both former JCNA Regional Directors) at Tom's left. Tom, Harvey and I gathered there again for a last time in 2012. On 2/5/2018, there was a wonderful and touching celebration of Harvey's life at the Lakehouse Hotel in San Marcos with well over 100 family and friends in attendance relating their memories of his life well and fully lived. Thank you, Tolly, for sharing Harvey with all of us for so many happy times over the years in the international circle of his friends!

Now, during the cooler weather days here in SDGO, I ask our wonderful, enthusiastic and professional team of 20(!) certified judges to make the most of your down-time to spare a bit of effort away from TLC of your Jaguars to review the basics of our "JCNA Concours d'Elegance and Judges' Rule Book" (2017 edition, for the moment). Although the AGM at San Antonio in March will consider some evolutionary tweaks, there is no anticipation of significant changes to the underlying philosophy or criteria of how we do our tasks on concours day (Saturday, 14 July 2018). I ask you to refresh your familiarity with JCNA Rule Book chapters III (Judging Ethics) and VI (Non-Authenticity scoring), as well as the JCNA Judging Guides for the jewels of your expertise, in particular. This will help you when we do the recertification testing in May and June.

2018 Concours Judges Training. Preparations have begun for our Saturday July 14th Concours being held at Spanish Landing Park. Hats Off to Mark Hodges, our Concours Chair for doing the many tasks it takes to make our event happen! Provided below is a summary of the three types of Concours related training that I will offer this year. **Please RSVP to me at least 3 days before any class that you plan to attend so that there will be plenty of refreshments and training materials available.**

 <u>Concours 101.</u> A classroom presentation, show and tell, and informal discussion of JCNA concours for those unfamiliar with concours but interested in learning about it. No experience is required; you only need an interest in learning more about JCNA concours. One weekend session is planned on May 12th beginning at 1:30 PM in the San Diego Auto Museum training room. The session will last about 90 minutes.

- <u>Concours 201 (Optional)</u>. A session to get Apprentice Judges and Judges whose certification has expired (or is about to) up to speed so that they can participate as Certified Judges at our 2018 Concours. Experience as an Apprentice Judge or former JCNA certified Judge is required. Hands on judging of Jaguars using official score sheets, JCNA Concours Rule Books and JCNA Judge's Guides will be emphasized.
 One weekend session is optional, depending on your feedback for interest in this event. I'll welcome timely input until May 12th by email or phone. <u>A volunteer will be most welcome to host the event</u>.
- <u>Concours 301.</u> The formal, annual Judges Refresher Training required each year by JCNA to recertify Judges for the current concours year includes a classroom presentation, a review of the more important aspects of the JCNA Concours Rule Book, and discussions of the Rule Book changes for 2018. I plan to highlight the outcome of significant initiatives addressed at the 23-24 March 2018 AGM and their potential impact on our activities. The written 2018 Judges' Test will be administered. Everyone is welcome to attend. This is an excellent way for Judges and Entrants to learn more about JCNA Concours Rules. Two weekend sessions are planned: Session 1 on May 12th at the San Diego Auto Museum beginning at 9 AM, and session 2 on Saturday June 16th beginning at 9 AM at Classic Showcase in Oceanside. Each session normally lasts about 3 hours.

1-4 November International Jaguar Festival, Fess Parker Resort on Sterns Beach, Santa Barbara, CA (Judges: Heads up! Our club will be expected to support the concours portion of the event Friday 2 November with a sizeable contingent of certified judges – more to follow!) Preparations are underway for our 14 July 2018 Concours d'Elegance and we are looking for members interested in becoming Certified JCNA Concours Judges. Several new Judges were certified in 2017 (Big thanks and congratulations!), but we still need more. We are definitely looking for a few good women and men to become Concours Judges.
