





Notes from the Judges Tent

This month, we'll first focus on some "Hot Wash-up" results of the JCNA Annual General Meeting (AGM) 24 March 2018 pertinent to concours judging. These comments are summarized for the sake of brevity. Be sure to read the full minutes text when available on the JCNA website.

AGM 18 Concours Committee Summary:

• Concours Class Consolidation – a number of the Concours classes have little participation resulting in a lack of competition.

Action

- 1. The Concours Committee will study this issue and prepare a Class consolidation proposal, if deemed appropriate, to be presented at the 2019 AGM
- Concours Program The participation of modern Jaguar cars is creating an unnecessary and time-consuming judging process for the newer Jaguars, as a result of using Rules and Scoring Sheets intended for judging restored Jaguar cars. The modern Jaguars have not aged to the point of requiring restoration.

Actions

- 1. Consider the development of a Vintage Concours and Modern Concours Program
- 2. Urge JCNA to consider Rules and Scoring sheets for Modern Jaguars that is commensurate with the necessary judging of these unrestored Jaguars.
- 3. The Concours Committee to review this issue and prepare a proposal to be presented at the 2019 AGM.

AGM 18 Judge's Concours Rules Committee (JCRC) Activity Summary:

- XK120 Judging Guide: The guide was reviewed by Dick Cavicke at a Friday AGM seminar, followed the next day by delegate approval of TRIAL concours use in 2018, and a vote at the 2019 AGM regarding final acceptance. XK 120's registering will need to provide original engine & chassis #s and build date to enable assigned judging teams to properly prepare due to wide configuration variability.
- Judge's Test: An update of the Judge's Test will be distributed, to JCNA Chief Judges in April 2018.
- Fire Extinguishers: Clarified the Special Division, Class S1/PD, Fire Extinguisher requirements to be contingent on the conditions under which the Entry qualified for the class. Active racers must have.
- Wire, Alloy Wheel and Brake-Component Cleanliness Judging: Clarified the cleanliness judging of wire and alloy wheels and visible brake components. (New: Judge the visible brake discs, calipers, and brake drums for cleanliness only; exclude light brake dust.) "If it can be seen, it should be clean."
- White Wall Tires: Clarified the authenticity of white wall tires, in Champion Division, is contingent on their being officially offered for the Entry in the applicable Spare Parts Catalog.
- Miscellaneous: Rule Book administrative edits and scoresheet format corrections were proposed by the Rule Book Editor, Steve Kennedy. JCRC approved their incorporation.

SDJC 2018 Concours Judges Training.

Preparations have begun for our Saturday July 14th Concours being held at Spanish Landing Park. Please RSVP to me at least 3 days before any class that you plan to attend so that there will be plenty of refreshments and training materials available. See the SDJC website to RSVP.

- <u>Concours 101.</u> A classroom presentation, show and tell, and informal discussion of JCNA concours for those unfamiliar with concours but interested in learning about it. One weekend session is planned on May 12th beginning at 1:30 PM in the San Diego Auto Museum training room. The session will last about 90 minutes.
- Concours 201 (Optional). A session to get Apprentice Judges and Judges whose certification has expired (or is about to) up to speed so that they can participate as Certified Judges at our 2018 Concours. Hands on judging of Jaguars using official score sheets, JCNA Concours Rule Books and JCNA Judge's Guides will be emphasized. A volunteer will be most welcome to host the event. Scheduling dependent upon level of interest.

<u>Concours 301.</u> The formal, annual Judges Refresher Training required each year by JCNA to recertify Judges for the current concours year includes a classroom presentation, a review of the more important aspects of the JCNA Concours Rule Book, and discussions of the Rule Book changes for 2018. The written 2018 Judges' Test will be administered. Session 1 on May 12th at the San Diego Auto Museum beginning at 9 AM, and session 2 on Saturday June 16th beginning at 9 AM at Classic Showcase in Oceanside. Each session normally lasts about 3 hours.

Technical Tip – Otter Switches on XK Engines

Virtually every year we see otherwise very well prepared early cars presented with incorrect thermostatic switch connectors mounted. The thermostat (also called an "Otter" switch) is used for the starting-carburetor solenoid. The most common issues are spade vs. threaded connectors and improper mounting hardware. From engine no. W.1251 onward (those we see most often), cars were fitted with the C.2474 thermostat/Otter switch shown here. It is fastened to the water outlet elbow by three nickel-plated hex-headed bolts which may be marked "R", "S" or dimpled in the center, with shake proof washers. A single wire from the thermostat/Otter switch (fastened by a unique nickel-plated dome nut), attaches to the starter-carburetor solenoid. The switch style changed to a Lucas (blade) style connector, part number C.22516 in late 1962 (reference the 1961 and 1962 master parts catalogs and 2011 & 2016 JCNA Authenticity Help Line and Protest Committee findings on the subject)



15th Annual SDJC Day at the San Diego County Fair Thursday, June 28, 2018


