





A few members of the San Diego Jaguar Club participated in the Triumph Clubsponsored 2018 BCCC Ball Bearing Breaker Rally on June 2, 2018. The 90-mile, 2.5-hour rally started at the Olive Garden, at 11555 Carmel Mountain Road in San Diego, and finished at the La Carreta Restaurant at 1347 Tavern Rd, Alpine, CA. The first car left the Olive Garden parking lot at 10:01 am. It is unknown when the last car pulled into the La Carreta parking lot.

There were three chances to win awards in this fun and challenging road event. One was a time/speed/distance leg. The car with the closest elapsed time to calculated true time won. The second was to examine clues and/or photos between the numbered route instructions to find and identify signs or landmarks along the way. Awards to cars with the most correct answers. The third was a random drawing of poker cards along the route for best poker hand.

Katherine Partain, and her navigator friend, wanna-be Jaguar owner, Shirley Smith, brought home two of the available nine prizes. The First-Place winner in the time/speed/distance leg was 13 seconds off of the calculated true time. Notes from the Concours Iudges Tent



August 2018 By Pete Rieth, Chief Judge, San Diego Jaguar Club

Concours Day was beautiful! The always accurate local weather gurus foretold a glorious day by the bay, and for once, they were right.

In order to hold our concours, there are many moving parts as we all know. From the judging perspective alone, we need a lot of dedicated individuals to serve as judges, Scrutineers, Apprentice Judges, Scorekeepers and Score Sheet Runners. Because of JCNA requirements that all Judges be certified and current, we rely heavily on the judges from other clubs to augment our own judge cadre. In addition to the judges, we need Scrutineers to initially review the score sheets for accuracy and to correct errors, and Score Keepers to tabulate scores. To keep all this paper flowing smoothly, one or more Score Sheet Runners are essential to ensure the judging and specialist teams are able to focus on their primary duties. 

Hi, Mitch here.
