





SDJC DRIVE - LOOP TO THE LAKE

Based on an informal poll of the 48 participants on the *Loop to the Lake Drive* on Saturday, September 15, the event was a great success, even if a few drivers got a little "loopy" along the way. More on this in a minute. The drive started at Starbuck's in Rancho San Diego, an excellent location suggested by Mark Hodges, SDJC Webmaster and Concours Chair, who lives in the area. When Jorgene and I first laid out the route, we checked out the starting point: Lots of available parking? Check. Coffee, food, and bathroom facilities? Check. Place to gather in the shade? Check. This all worked according to plan on the day of the drive, plus we enjoyed the company of a group of bike riders who used Starbucks as a rest point in their ride. Several of us learned that even with fully up-to-date SatNav software in our Jaguars, it is often a good idea to doublecheck the route to the starting point via an on-line mapping program. The Jaguar guidance system sent several members in a bit of a roundabout loop in the area while literally in sight of Starbucks (was this an omen?).

After leaving Starbucks, the group headed northeast toward the Sycuan casino, quickly departing the more obvious signs of city living It was a gorgeous day, with the temperatures in the low 80s. To my knowledge, only one Jaguar overheated, a record I believe for a late summer drive! Jorgene and I weren't the first ones out of the parking lot, but the instructions were clear - or so we thought. What could go wrong? Well, about 15 minutes into the first leg of the drive, the lead car decided they were off course, pulled to the side of the road, and turned around, with several other cars in tow. Since we knew the route, I waved to the driver to stay the course, which they did, rejoining the group near the back of the pack. As we continued on the drive, I was wondering if my directions were less than clear (I took them straight from Google maps based on the route I had mapped out and checked them during our test drive). I decided it was a slight case of the driver getting a bit loopy. At this point, we took over the head of the pack and proceeded on with the drive through Guatay and Pine Valley, and on to the Buckman Springs waypoint. However, while admiring the gorgeous scenery, I saw a sign to I8, which I knew we were to pass under to stay on old Highway 80. Despite the objections of my navigator ("This isn't what the directions say!"), I barreled ahead, with a half-dozen cars following, only to pass under I8 and run straight into a dead end! Fortunately, it had a convenient loop area to turn around in, so little was lost other than a minute of two and the pride of yours truly. The remainder of the trip was loopy-free, although after my escapade, one driver punched in Buckman Springs on their SatNav and just headed straight there on I8 East.

After the rest stop, we headed west at a brisk pace (at least for some of us) on I8 West to *Anthony's Fish Grotto* in La Mesa where we enjoyed an outdoor, lake-side lunch. Since *Anthony's* is known as being dog-friendly (as it says so on their large outdoor sign), several members brought their best friends along. Jorgene and I frequently eat at *Anthony's* and knew that the venue and food would be good. We and others weren't disappointed. Feedback from club members was very positive, with the only negative comment relayed to me being "Why haven't we come here before?". Who knows, perhaps we'll use this as an end point for another backcountry drive in 2019.





The Inland Empire Jaguar Club (IEJC) returned to mile-high Idyllwild for their 5th Annual Jagstravaganza Concours. The festivities started on Friday if you spent the weekend in one of the cabins or themed rooms of the host site, the Idyllwild Inn. Those who arrived early enough had dinner together at the Gastronome Restaurant across the street.

The weather was cool Saturday morning and warmed up just as judging started at 10 am. 12 Jaguars made it up the hill from San Diego; 9 were judged and three were put on display and not judged. There was another dozen or so from the LA, Inland Empire, and Arizona clubs.

Tom Krefetz brought his 1963 XKE; Craig Wright and Mary Ann Ward brought their grey 1965 E-Type; Bob & Ali Proctor brought their 1969 XKE; Elizabeth Soens brought her 1994 XJ6; Lisa Ellis brought her 1996 XJS; Lou Galper brought his 1997 X300; Brian Ellis brought his 1999 XJ8; Ed & Karen Soens brought their 2001 XK8; Dave, Marie & Matthew Allen brought their 2002 XK8 and their 2007 XJ8; Nedra Rummell brought her 2014 F-Type convertible; and Dev & I brought our 2014 XKR,

Judging finished a little before 2 pm, so we all gathered around the hospitality cabin for the raffle and then retired to our own cabins to rest before the awards dinner. Some of us went shopping since there were many specialty shops well within walking distance.

The IEJC again reserved the rear patio of Ferro Italian Restaurant, one of the fanciest restaurants in Idyllwild, for the awards dinner. There was plenty of staff and plenty of servers. We were without want of anything. Social hour and appetizers started at 6:00 pm and dinner followed about an hour later.

Mike and Chief Judge Charlie Hallums announced the awards during dinner and I took the pictures of all the awards and took notes.

CALL FOR 2019 NOMINEES FOR CLUB OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

It's election time again!



In accordance with the SDJC By-Laws, the Election Chairperson, Dan Jensen, has developed a list of nominees to fill pending vacancies. Open positions for 2019 include:

- President open to current or former SDJC Officers and Directors
- First Vice President open to all SDJC members
- Director (two openings) open to all SDJC members

Descriptions of responsibilities for each position are available at the SDJC website. Select the *Club Members* tab and look for "Duties of Elected Club Officers". In addition to the descriptions provided therein, officers leaving their position at the end of 2018 will be more than happy to provide advice and counsel to members interested in one of the openings.

Per the club bylaws, the election will be carried out in the following manner:

- Nominations of Voting Members will be solicited from the general membership by an announcement in the September newsletter to fill each vacancy.
- 1. The Election Chairperson will publish the slate of nominees in the October issue of the newsletter. See page 32.
- 2. Ballots will be handed out to voting members at the November General Membership Meeting.
- 3. Members will vote within the allotted time.
- 4. Voting will be closed and ballots will be counted at the meeting by the Secretary and two (2) Members at large OR two (2) other Officers or Directors selected by the President.
- 5. Those individuals receiving the highest number of votes for each vacancy shall be elected.
- 6. The results of the election shall be announced at the November General Membership Meeting and published in the December newsletter.

NOTES FROM THE CONCOURS JUDGES TENT

October 2018 By Pete Rieth, Chief Judge, San Diego Jaguar Club



This article provides information about the Jaguar Clubs of North America (JCNA) Concours d'Elegance Program to help you understand more about this aspect of Jaguar ownership. If you are a seasoned concours Entrant, I hope this will help you enjoy it more. If you have never participated, I hope this will encourage you to join in the fun.

2018 SDJC Concours Analysis: I provided a list of the provisional scores for the 31 judged Entries at our Concours in the August Jaguar Tracks. They are now FINAL. This month I took a deeper look at the Entrants, Entries, Judges and other facets of our Concours and came up with these interesting facts:

- There were 57 Entries registered for our July 14th Concours, 31 Judged Entries and 26 for Display.
- 1 judged Entry was a NO SHOW and one was non-JCNA, hence not listed in the JCNA Online Scoring System of competitive standings.
- For JCNA standings, there were 21 SDJC judged Entries (68%), 6 Jaguar Owners Club of LA Entries (19%), 2 Inland Empire Jaguar Club Entries (7%), 1 Jaguar Club of Central Arizona Entry (3%) and 1 Jaguar Club of Southern Arizona (3%) Entry. [In round percentage numbers.....for you higher math wizards.]
- Of the 31 Entries that were judged, 16 were in Champion Division, 2 were in Special Division and 13 were in Driven Division.
- A 2014 F-Type was the newest Entry and a 1948 Mark IV DHC was the oldest Entry, spanning 66 years.
- One Entry received a perfect score this year: Colin Seid's and Rick Annis' 1948 Mark IV DHC in Champion Division. Martin Avery's 1965 E-Type OTS took highest Driven Division score (9.998). Tom Krefetz scored highest in Special Division with his 1963 E-Type FHC (9.996).
- There were three classes with 3 Entries, C11/J8 (including one non-JCNA Entrant), C20/F and D10K8.
- There were six classes with 2 Entries, C5/E1, C9/XJ, C13/JS, D8/XJS, D11/XK and S2/MOD.
- There were eleven classes with only 1 Entry, all receiving uncontested First Place Awards.
- Nine Entries received First Place awards while competing against others in their Class.
- Nine received Second Place awards while competing against others in their Class.
- Two Entries received Third Place awards while competing against others in their Class.
- There were 21 Judges, 15 (+ 1 Apprentice) from SDJC (71%), 5 from Jaguar Owners Club of LA (JOCLA + 1 Apprentice) (24%), and 1 from Inland Empire Jaguar Club (IEJC) (5%). For comparison, in 2015, we had more Judges from other clubs (55%) than SDJC (45%) at our Concours.
- There were no formal protests. There were 3 post-event score changes (Down from 4 the year prior and 8 in 2017 that's a great trend!).

Looking for a Few Good Women and Men for Concours Judges.

Preparations are already in work for our 2019 Concours d'Elegance and we are looking for members interested in becoming Certified Concours Judges. We would like to grow — OR RECERTIFY - our current list of 17 fully current SDJC Judges by three or more Judges by Concours day 2019. I will be offering Concours Training classes again next May and June for those interested in learning more about JCNA Concours or becoming Judges.
