2019 AGM Report

The Jaguar Clubs of North America had its annual business meeting on March 21-24, JLR HQ., Mahwah NJ. The AGM (Annual General Meeting) is an opportunity for all JCNA Jaguar Clubs in North America to come together and discuss, share, update, and propose new ideas and ways to promote membership recruitment and retention; evaluate the JCNA Concours Program; discuss Concours Judging criteria; make suggestions on participation in JCNA RALLY and SLALOM programs; and improve the communications between Clubs within the JCNA Regions.

Also, a new President and Vice President were elected as well as Regional Directors were confirmed. Last year's President, Jack Humphrey, had to step down for personal reasons and VP Barbara Grayson took the position of acting President until the AGM. This year the new JCNA President is Les Hamilton from the JAGUAR ASSOCIATE GROUP of the Bay Area. Les has been serving as Southwest Regional Representative for the past year. Mike Meyer from the Jaguar Club of Ohio was elected Vice President, taking over from Barbara Grayson. Mark Mayuga was appointed Southwest Regional Representative by President Jack Humphrey when Jack stepped down as JCNA President and Southwest Regional Representative. SDJC's own Pete Reith was appointed to the Jaguar Concours Rules Committee by the Rules Chairman.

This year there were many interesting reports from the various JCNA Committees having to do with Membership, Rally, Slalom, and Concours. The most controversial item was the proposed splitting of the Concours Divisions into two distinct groups, VINTAGE and MODERN CARS. The ideas were to create a different Judging criterion for the MODERN CARS which have less areas to be judged and authenticity was not really an issue. The presentations were made, then the fireworks began, and the issues were returned to the Chief Judge and Rules Committee for further study. It got a bit steamy in the room from the comments and differing opinions.

There was much discussion that centered on how JCNA could help local clubs recruit new members and retain current membership. New ideas were presented in the Committee report and many clubs were happy to see new approaches and ideas. Serving as representative of the JCNA Passport to Service (PTS), I reported on the PTS statistics for 2018 and goals for 2019. Mark Mayuga was asked to serve as Chairman of the International Jaguar Festival (IJF) Event Committee, based on our successful event in 2018. He submitted two articles to the Jag Journal which are in publication and will become the official guide for clubs that want to put on an IJF or major regional event.

And as a final note, I had the honor of accepting the JCNA Presidents Award for Dick Cavicke in his absence! You'll be hearing more about Dick's award and recognition later on.

A Drive Through Rainbow

FINALLY!!

There is a saying – "the third times a charm", and it happened on April 6th. After this being rescheduled two different times due to rainy weather, we were finally able to call it a go. And I will admit, when I looked out over the City of El Cajon and the hills past Santee – the clouds and fog did not promise a good weather day. Yet, an hour later, as I left to head north to the I-15 and SR-78 exit where we were scheduled to meet, an amazing thing happened, THE SUN CAME OUT! and the day could not have been more perfect. I can't believe I finally beat the odds, and was able to run the long awaited "Rainbow Drive".

We left the Park N Ride, proceeded thru the streets of downtown Fallbrook, and then made our way to De Luz Rd. This road is about 15 miles of twisting, mountain hugging corners in the first section. Then you are taken thru a section where the lanes become very narrow as you disappear into an endless stretch with tree top canopies that cover the road for miles. Here the trees are very close to the sides of the winding asphalt road and many show scars from past car crashes. The previous rains turned the countryside into lush green growths of grass, and there was a rainbow of colored flowers everywhere you looked. The flowers ranged from lavender blooms that lined a fence to patches of poppies, in vibrant orange.

As we traveled towards Murrieta, the road has many low spots that dip where the creek runs through the properties. The water used to wash over the road and flooded in each spot. But to my surprise, each one of the dips had new concrete and culvert tubes that routed the water under the road instead of over the top of it. The peaceful sounds of water trickling over the rocks helped set the tone for a relaxing drive, knowing that our cats would not be swimming the whole way. There was only one place we slowed down to tip toe thru the wash over. I learned when I ran the test drive the days before not to underestimate how deep the water could be in that one spot. Thinking is was shallow, I never slowed down from my clicking pace, and SPLASH! I hit the water like my car had just done a belly flop off the high dive.

The next section of the drive was along the elevated hill ridges, with breathtaking views of Temecula seen down below, as we wound down the hills to the valley below. This is where the group split up, once we reached the I-15 freeway in downtown Temecula. The drive directions had options, either get onto the freeway and head for lunch in Escondido, or continue through Rainbow and the Lilac Road, destination varying. There were members that were able to join us for the hour and half drive, but had later engagements elsewhere, so the I-15 freeway was the perfect end of the drive for some. The group then drove to Marie Calendar's for lunch before calling it a day.

Amazingly, as the group turned into the parking lot for lunch, one member's car died and was pushed into a parking spot. So, luck was not only on my side that day. If the car had died out on the drive instead of at the end it could have been tragic. The strain of strutting around in those high heels all day made that kitty refuse to go another step, so it just called for an Uber to get home. Kinda....

A "Working" Trip to the Largest Concours in Mexico

The 33rd annual *Gran Concurso Internacional de Elegancia* took place on April 6th and 7th, 2019 at Dos Rios, Huixquilucan, Mexico. Tom Krefetz and Pete Rieth have, by invitation, teamed to provide judging support to the JCNA sanctioned event organized by Club Jaguar of Mexico (CJM) for over 12 years. Jamie Holbrook, Harvey Williamson and Bob Anderson (we miss them!), and other JCNA judges from the San Antonio and Austin clubs (e.g., Brian Blackwell, Greg Nel and Jeff Snyder) have also participated in various years. Club Jaguar's first concours was in 1985 in Chapultepec Park, and has been at this site since 1989. Over the years, the event has mushroomed to the limits of the Las Caballerizas Dos Rios site (a former equestrian club) located southwest of Mexico City about halfway to Toluca. The picturesque location is in pine-forested hills at a sunny altitude of more than 8900 feet. Recent concours have hosted up to 550 cars and motorcycles of more than three dozen marques from Jaguar and Rolls Royce to Isettas and Datsuns in an event spanning two days. This year's event hosted about 465 cars and bikes of many marques. The event commemorated the 60th anniversary of the Jaguar MK 2 and the 50th anniversary of the Jaguar XJ.





Our activities, as in past years, began with a flight from Tijuana airport (reached via the Cross-Border Express "tunnel" on Thursday April 4th. Upon arrival, we were met by Alexander Mena and went to an office facility downtown for the JCNA-required annual joint Rule Book training session chaired by CJM President and Chief Judge Jeff Carlson. The briefing and discussion were presented by Pete Rieth for certified judges of SDJC and Club Mexico, followed by lively discussion of recent rule changes applicable to the classic vintages. We enjoyed a working dinner of delicious heavy hors d'oeuvres before checking in at our hotel.

Friday morning began early, with a quick breakfast and a drive to the suburbs where we formed a caravan of cars to be relocated to the event site. This entails a beautiful one hour drive along fine highways and through small mountain villages (Read many speed bumps or 'topes'). After arrival, we joined our Mexican friends for their annual club luncheon at the wonderful restaurant on the grounds. Good fellowship among old friends abounded as we enjoyed the finest Mexican cuisine. Making our late afternoon way back to the city after cleaning and securing the cars, we enjoyed cocktails at Jeff and Sarita Carlson's suburban home while examining the Series III E-type that Jeff fully restored himself.



Saturday, April 6th dawned beautifully. After a snack in our hotel, we ferried out to the site where many last-minute preps were underway. A catered breakfast on site at the same restaurant got us fueled for the day ahead. In addition to the show cars, the distributors and car manufacturers that yearly exhibit include Jeep, BMW, Porsche and of course Jaguar-Land Rover. Following a briefing for Judges by Jeff Carlson, we were organized into teams according to our expertise and commenced judging. Meanwhile, the same was happening within each of the other clubs represented. Judging, adjudication of protests and score sheet reviews continued into the late afternoon, with only minor interruption by a freak hail storm. Live music added to the pleasant atmosphere. An excellent catering team kept the club members well fueled throughout both days of the event.

I must say that seeing (and recording) Tom at work as he judges E-types, early XKs and other models is a fascinating exercise in 'sipping from a firehose of knowledge'. We've often performed courtesy assessments after the formal judging when time is not a constraint, only darkness, in order to help owners improve their cars. Wrapping up and securing the cars for the night took some time. Then we all headed back to Mexico City for a mellow, late dinner at CJM Treasurer Alejandro Isoard's home/'man cave', and a short night of rest and relaxation.

By the way, in Mexico there is the Mexican Federation that groups and organizes different types of sports, and under this is the Vintage Automotive Association that unites and supports collectors' car clubs. Enrique Vila is its President and also a Past President of Club Jaguar Mexico.





Sunday morning early brought us out on the road again. Sunday is the event finale. Cross-Club judging in the 'Corral' containing the best car of each club selected the Best American Car (a 1931 Chrysler Runabout), the Best European Car (a 1948 Cisitalia 202 GT coupe), and the Best of Show (the Cisitalia). Other events included an afternoon spectacular award ceremony complete with live music, stage decorations and fashion show, parade of Winners, confetti blasts and colorful ribbons. Then came the denouement of restoring the site to pristine condition (and Afterglow in the CJM hospitality tent), returning the cars (in the dark) to their city homes, a quick snack for hungry judges, fond adios, Buen Viajes, abrazos, and wrapping up arrangements for the flights home next morning.





Monday April 8th brought creaks and groans and serious need for coffee (those of you who are judges know what I mean after judging 6 or more cars on each of the days before), and a long run eastward to the airport for the journey back to San Diego via Tijuana.

For those of you who haven't been to Mexico City recently, you would be amazed at how this city of 23 plus million people has blossomed and modernized since the devastating Richter 8.0 earthquake of September 1985 that caused 40,000 casualties and left 250,000 homeless. Today, the city is beautiful and vibrant. The former pollution problems have been significantly reduced. Rush hour, though, is still a challenge as in any big city. Public transport is excellent. Safety is not an issue in the popular areas.





As with each prior year, our very good friends in CJM have been superb hosts with whom we have forged marvelous memories and lasting friendships. Memories include the wedding of a CJM President's daughter to a US Naval Officer at the SDGO ASW Base Officers' Club; an unforgettable afternoon at the site when Enrique and Pepe (a retired Chrysler engineer) drove a Lynx D-type in lazy donuts around the (then) vacant display field under golden sun; a sweaty palms Sunday evening drive back from the site to the city outskirts in a 3.8S with no reverse gear and bad lights, a cold midnight trying to resuscitate a dead E-Type high in a mountain pass, visits to the homes of various Collectors to view impressive exemplars of automotive history, and so forth. One of my many personal 'mosts' was an hour sitting with our friend Israel Leitman in the rear seat of his original 1938 Cadillac saloon discussing not only his near-perfect 1961 Outside Bonnet Latch E-Type, but also the past and potential future of our vintage hobby in contrast with the emergence of Modern Jaguars and their owners' interests.





Getting to know the members, families and histories of our fellow clubs is how, in my opinion, being a JCNA / SDJC member helps to fill out life's picture.

This year's Rolling British Car Day had a North County and South County starting point. The North starting point was Kelly's Pub in a small strip mall on Bernardo Center Drive. The South starting point was the Sprint Store on Fletcher Parkway in El Cajon.

Due to the tragic shooting at the Chabad of Poway on Saturday, Joanie Berkwitz, President of SDBCCC had to rework the Northern route that Saturday evening. Rancho Bernardo Road, which was part of the original route was to be closed on Sunday. A new route was chosen and then all the Northern route sheets had to be recopied. Joanie's kind words for those at the Chabad of Poway who were truly affected by this tragedy were heartfelt and very thoughtful.

Both groups departed at their designated time, with the plan that we would cross paths as we came into Ramona. The Northern route took us around Starvation Mountain on Highland Valley Road. Then turning on Archie Moore Road to Highway 67 into Ramona. Leaving Ramona, we headed to Santa Ysabel by way of Old Julian Highway. From Santa Ysabel we took Wynola Road and Julian Orchard Drive to our final designation, Menghini Winery.

During the route, one of the early mini's, owned by Nancy Homer, which is restored to look like a miniature police car was stopped by the Ramona Police. They accused Nancy of impersonating a Police Officer. After several minutes of discussion with the police, Nancy said she used her charm to convince them to let her go on her way.

Notes from the Concours Judges Tent

2019 Concours Judges Training.

Preparations have begun for our Saturday July 13th Concours being held at Spanish Landing Park **EAST**. Hats Off to Mark Hodges, our President and Concours Chair (among other things), for doing the many tasks it takes to make our event happen! Provided below is a summary of the three types of Concours-related training that I will offer this year.

- <u>Concours 101.</u> A classroom presentation, show and tell, and informal discussion of JCNA concours for those unfamiliar with concours but interested in learning about it. No experience is required; you only need an interest in learning more about JCNA concours. One weekend session is planned on May 18th beginning at 1:30 PM in the San Diego Auto Museum training room. The session will last about 90 minutes.
- <u>Concours 201.</u> A session to get Apprentice Judges and Judges whose certification has expired (or is about to) up to speed so that they can participate as Certified Judges at our 2019 Concours. Experience as an Apprentice Judge or former JCNA certified Judge is a "plus", but any member is welcome to participate. Hands on judging of Jaguars using official score sheets, JCNA Concours Rule Books and JCNA Judge's Guides will be emphasized. One weekend session (June 29/30 TBD) will be held for Apprentices and anyone else wishing to brush up a bit on concours judging processes. A volunteer will be most welcome to host the event.
- Concours 301. The formal, annual Judges' Refresher Training is required each year by JCNA to recertify Judges for the current concours year. It includes a classroom presentation, a review of the more important aspects of the JCNA Concours Rule Book (now available for download or purchase at JCNA.com/Events/Concours) and discussions of the Rule Book changes for 2019. I plan to highlight the outcome of significant initiatives addressed at the 23 March 2019 AGM and their potential impact on our activities. The written 2019 Judges' Test will be administered. Everyone is welcome to attend. This is an excellent way for Judges and Entrants to learn more about JCNA Concours Rules. Two weekend sessions are planned: Session 1 on Saturday May 18th at the San Diego Auto Museum beginning at 9 AM, and Session 2 on Saturday June 22nd beginning at 9 AM at Classic Showcase in Oceanside. Each session normally lasts about 3 hours.

Please RSVP to me <u>via the Club Website</u> at least 5 days before any class that you plan to attend so that there will be plenty of refreshments and training materials available. (Thanks, Mark Hodges, for adding this easy-to-use website feature!)

Also present, Pete Rieth, Chief Judge; Dan Jensen, Advertising Sales.

President's Report: Mark – none

Secretary's Report: Ali – March meeting minutes approved electronically.

Treasurer's Report: Dave – March month activities include income of \$2,980.25 comprising \$420.10 Club dues, \$300.00 advertising, \$286.00 from sales of logo items and \$1974.15 for luncheons. Expenses for the month were \$3,190.19 comprising \$120.00 JCNA dues, \$100.00 for deposit for sound and music at the Concours d'Elegance, \$2,733.77 payments to The Green Dragon Tavern for the 60th Birthday Party, \$119.42 for Jaguar Tracks hard copies for local dealers and \$117.00 for the storage facility.
