San Diego Padres vs. Miami Marlins

This was a spontaneous event I suggested at the New Members Appreciation Luncheon. I reserved the Bud Patio area just for the San Diego Jaguar Club. It is a section for private parties that has bar-type seating, with ledges and bar-height seats instead of stadium seats. It also has the benefit of Budweiser beer sales right next to the private section, so minimal walking is required to get a cold one.

The weather was a little cloudy, and windy at times, but at least it wasn't raining. I have been told that I am the reason it rains for all the planned events. Looking at this year's events, there must be some truth to it. Maybe this will change the trend.

In May the Padres played 27 games, and they won 14 of them. This game was not one of them, as they lost 9 to 2. But the game did make the National News, but for a totally different reason. A swarm of bees took over the FOX Sports microphone near the dugouts, which caused a 30-minute delay in the second inning of the game.

The players vacated the field, and all the fans behind home plate left the stands as an exterminator in a beekeeper's suit climbed a ladder to spray the swarm, and them vacuumed them up. The Padres have had problems with bees before. In a pre-season game in 2017 against the Colorado Rockies in Arizona, bees swarmed home plate sending all the players ducking for cover.

The Padres use Cartwright Exterminators for issues like this and their decision to spray the swarm and kill them instead of using live removal resulted in a public uproar. The killing of a queen bee and hundreds of worker bees when the bee population is at critical numbers really angered everyone. Luckily none of us were stung, so other than the Padre loss it was an enjoyable day at the ballpark.










Notes from the Concours Judges Tent

July 2019 By Pete Rieth, Chief Judge, San Diego Jaguar Club



Concours Day is upon us! The always accurate local weather gurus foretell a glorious day by the bay.

Our cadre of experienced judges has completed the required annual refresher training and proficiency testing. We're very pleased to welcome a new Judge to the team for 2019: Diane Bauman. We also have two new Apprentices nearing certification as of "Press Time": Rudy Hradecky and John Baiha.

Our thanks go to both the San Diego Auto Museum's Herb Johnson, Patrick Heffernan and staff and also to Tom Krefetz' Classic Showcase for providing wonderful teaching venues for Concours 301 training. There's nothing like having a full-up, detailed XK cutaway engine, a 100-point MK IV, SS100, SS Touring, and an XK 120 FHC at your elbow as teaching aids! Debbie's yummy munchies also really helped to keep the trainee judges' attention active. We had 15 Judges and Apprentices participating, including Chief Judge Emeritus Dick Cavicke who provided some perspectives on future Concours organization. Guests included Mark Mayuga and Charlie Hallums, JOCLA President & Chief Judge respectively.

On Concours day we are very happy again to have our Scorekeepers in a team effort to ensure the numbers are RIGHT. For those of you who haven't noticed this somewhat 'behind the scenes' activity, it is a crucial part of bringing an accurate result to the Awards Ceremony in timely fashion. Judges this year will also rotate through duty in the Judges' Tent as Scrutinizers. Matt Allen has again kindly volunteered as Scoresheet Runner to expedite the judging schedule.

Here's a summary of how the scoring review process works - After each judge team Leader turns in a set of score sheets (Interior, Exterior, Engine and [OV] for Champion, or only Interior, Exterior and OV for Driven) to the Judges' tent, a series of reviews happens: First, two Scrutinizers review to ensure the sheets are filled out completely and correctly per the JCNA Rule Book, using a checklist and returning those needing corrections. Next, the sheets pass to the Scorekeepers, who again review the scored entries for numeric accuracy and tally each sheet to calculate an overall score for the entry. Finally, all entries' scores are compiled on a single sheet which the Chief Judge and Concours Chair review and use during the Awards Ceremony to announce winners of Third, Second and First Place trophies in each competing class (Champion, Special and Driven). After Concours day, the Chief Judge again reviews all score sheets for accuracy, making corrections if warranted, and reports provisional scores and the Judge Roster to JCNA. After adjudicating any formal protests, the scores become final for purposes of Regional and North American competition.



By the way, I went to your website to find your e-mail address and got to look at past issues of your newsletter. Very nicely done. It beats what I see on other's sites.



Jaguar XK120 Restoration Lessons Learned by John Gegner

Book Review: Well, every great book deserves a sequel. I had earlier reviewed "Jaguar XK120 DHC, Installing the Soft Top and Headliner" by John Gegner and Gregg Philbrick and I realized that the soft top installation was only part of the larger question, how do you start on and go about restoring a classic Jaguar without sending the car and large check to a professional restorer? Well the answer to my question was delivered by John in this more substantial, equally well written, story in 124 pages with 135 photos.



The author states the book "is not a substitute for already published restoration books", but I cannot imagine embarking on a classic car restoration without this book as a guide to what is a large home garage project. The book provides a rationale for the overall structure for a restoration project, how to sequence and manage the project and guidance on identifying the critical path to avoid rework or long periods of downtime. Preparing your workspace for the project and guidance on make versus buy are some of the great collection of common-sense hints and guidance provided by the work.

After setting the stage with the history of John's XK120 and workspace preparation, the book walks through each of the major stages and for each stage provides the cost of key parts and labor. Each section is followed by lesson learned, hints and tips, references to more detailed technical publications, all accompanied by illustrative color photos.

The book provides easy reading with an efficient use of words and I found it to be quite a page-turner during my review. Although the book describes John's adventure restoring his XK120, it provides a great basis for any classic Jaguar restoration as the project structure and many of lessons learnt and references are not XK120 specific. A great addition to any respectable Jaguar library at the cost of \$68 including shipping in the U.S.

BUTTONWILLOW DRIVING EVENT 2019 SATURDAY, Aug. 10th, 2019 8:30 AM to 4:00PM



This is a joint opportunity being brought to members of both the Jaguar and Mercedes Clubs to participate in a one-day driving experience, either on an individual or organized membership basis. This is a one-day performance driving and learning event on how to become a better driver and to learn more about the performance handling aspects of your car.

Buttonwillow Raceway Park is a motorsports park in <u>Kern County</u>, <u>California</u>, 10 miles (16 km) north of <u>the town of Buttonwillow</u> and 28 miles (45 km) northwest of <u>Bakersfield</u>. It is located just off the Buttonwillow exit on I-5. Constructed during World War 1 by world famous racing driver <u>Dario Resta</u>, it is now owned and operated by the California Sports Car Club, a region of <u>SCCA</u>. Buttonwillow is the "flagship" track of Cal Club, and is also the location of the Cal Club's administrative offices.
