The 2021 Jaguar F-Type

The 2021 Jaguar F-Type coupe and convertible receive a restyle and a handful of other tweaks. Jaguar has been updating features and expanding the F-Type lineup since its introduction for the 2014 model year, but visually the shouty two-door hasn't changed until now.

The highlights of the F-Type's new suit are the more flowing front end, larger grille, and redesigned LED head- and taillights. The headlights have shifted from a vertical to a horizontal orientation and, combined with the slightly upsized mouth, give the front end a more aggressive look. The clamshell hood has been redesigned to match, with a more dramatic sculpting and integrated vents relocated closer to the front of the engine compartment. Around back, the taillights get a more modern shape with harder angles.

Updates including Apple CarPlay and Android Auto carry over, but Jaguar has finally given the 2021 F-Type a reconfigurable TFT-screen gauge cluster, with unique graphics and sport-focused elements including a shift light display.


For 2021, the F-Type R has been updated with more power, now matching the old SVR at 575 horsepower and 516 lb-ft of torque. The stability control and power-steering software have been recalibrated, wider tires fitted, and new springs and anti-roll bars installed along with other suspension tweaks. Jaguar says the changes should improve the feel of the car and drop the 0-60 mph sprint to 3.5 seconds.

Rounding out the R's changes is a quiet-start mode that promises not to wake up the neighborhood every morning when you leave the house.

Behind the Badge: The Ferocious Jaguar Emblem and What It Represents



If there's one automotive brand's badge that perfectly imitates its company's name, it's the Jaguar. This leaping feline is easily one of the most recognizable and beloved emblems on the road. For years, this sleek, silver sculpture has adorned premium British performance cars around the globe. But where did the Jaguar get its design and what does it represent?

Why Jaguar Cars Used to Be the SS

The Jaguar brand actually began as the Swallow Sidecar Company in 1922, founded by young British entrepreneurs William Walmsley and William Lyons. It wasn't until 1935 that the British company added the "Jaguar" name to its identity when it released the SS Jaguar sedan as a joint venture with chassis producer Standard Motor Company. Hence, the "SS" in this case became "Standard-Swallow." The early logo showcased the "SS" letters in a hexagon surrounded by a bird's wings and tail.

Once World War II changed the connotation of SS in the public's eye, the company's name and logo changed in 1945, dropping the "SS" and references to the swallow. Going by Jaguar Cars (meant to be distinct from any other foreign brand), the automaker introduced the emblem of a pouncing jaguar, representing the vehicles' grace, strength, and speed. The use of silver and black coloring further conveys sophistication. This leaping feline has remained relatively unchanged over the past 70 years, a notably exciting design and perfect hood ornament. Apart from going from a lined silhouette to solid silver, the Jaguar badge remains consistent.

As the "leaper" has been phased out as a hood ornament and moved to the back of the cars in a flat, profile-view form, a newer "growler" design is being used on front grilles. This showcases the jaguar's face and open mouth, surrounded by a silver ring and red background.

Despite passing hands from Ford to Tata Motors, Jaguar remains the ferocious brand its beastly logo emanates.

The purpose for such equipment is often misunderstood by Americans at car shows. In fact, sometimes they make crude and insensitive jokes about unreliable Jaguar cars needing such tools all the time. In fact, the tools were **NOT** provided because Jaguar cars often required their application. Indeed, this was very seldom the case.

These tools, included with Jaguar cars exported to the United States, were provided so that charitable Jaguar drivers would be properly equipped when they stopped to assist American drivers whose Detroit products were broken-down on the side of the road. This generous and thoughtful planning on the part of the Jaguar Company was solely intended as a subtle gesture of appreciation for American aid, however slight, in helping the British Empire to win World War II. 


