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# **Presidential Perspective**

With the COVID-19 pandemic running rampant across the globe, we are directly affected being a social club. Your Board of Directors and Functional Chairs are staying in constant contact with each other. We communicate mostly via email, writing each other about issues that affect the club. Decisions on how to proceed forward regarding club events are progressing. Decisions continually evolve based upon current situations and projected happenings. The decision to cancel the March 14 Drive to Julian and lunch at Jeremy's is a perfect example of this. We first kept the event open as registrations continued to pour in. As the pandemic grew, we decided to make the event optional with no penalty for those who cancelled after the cut-off date. As the situation worsened, we decided to cancel the event altogether. I feel we made the right decision because three days later on Tuesday, March 17, San Diego County's leading health officials, hospital executives, and county supervisors announced a series of mandatory and recommended health directives to combat the spread of COVID-19, the disease that causes the coronavirus. This means we were several days ahead of the curve.



Now, we look to the future. We look to the future for our personal lives and for the future of our club, which are intimately intertwined. As human beings, we adapt to changing situations and move on as best we can. The situation we find ourselves in is almost unprecedented. I have never seen so many empty store shelves in my life, but I have also never seen so many people coming together to help others in need. While I missed WWII by more than twenty years, and have no personal knowledge of how we adapted to that change, I equate this pandemic to wartime preparations. Companies are retooling to produce medical supplies; service organizations are working harder than ever to help those in need; and people are selflessly following government suggestions and directives by staying home and therefore limiting their exposure to others.

Your club leadership is very concerned for your safety and well-being. As of now, we have cancelled all club events for April, May, and June. I implore you not to lose interest during our down time. While I personally was not too concerned about my exposure to club members, I am concerned with our exposure to others we would come into contact with during club events. I have therefore directed club leaders to come up with activity ideas that limit, reduce, or eliminate the risk of exposure. We might come up with something; then again, we might not and just ride this thing out. There are many ways to keep in touch with each other without being physically present and I implore you to do as such. Please stay in touch with your club friends, even if it is a quick phone call or text. I am very proud of this club and am very proud of the people in this club. We are a great bunch of people and we will get through this. We might not get through this completely unscathed, but we will get through it.

On a more positive note, the 2020 JCNA Concours season is upon us. I just checked the JCNA calendar page and it looks like Concourses across North America are still on schedule. The Los Angeles Club's Concours is in May at the Muckenthaler Cultural Center as part of their annual car show and the Inland Empire Club's Concours is in October at the Idyllwild Inn. Registrations information and forms are on the Club Member's Page of our website.

Registration is also open for our SDJC Concours in July. I created a new 2020 Concours Page with all the info. Just look for it on the left menu bar. Due to popular demand, we are keeping the show at Cancer Survivor's Park on the east side of Spanish Landing. Registration is again electronic, using our Formbuilder Reservation System. As usual, payment will be by PayPal or by check. Unless things change for the worse, plan on our Concours to be business as usual. One great advantage to our location at Cancer Survivor's Park is the space. Last year I spaced the Jags farther apart than usual and this year I can space them even farther apart. We have more than enough room to leave plenty of space between the Jags, and therefore, between you all.

We will keep you informed as this situation develops. I am looking forward to seeing you all again once we get the 'all-clear' from the powers at be.


The day ended at "The Olde Ship" British Pub & Restaurant in Fullerton where a number of us went to wind after all the excitement of the day.



After the tour we were able to enjoy the wine tasting, or a picnic lunch either in the grassy area or at picnic tables in the shade next to the building.









# Notes from the Concours Judges Tent

# April 2020 By Pete Rieth, Chief Judge, San Diego Jaguar Club



This month, we'll first focus on some "Hot Wash-up" results of the JCNA Annual General Meeting (AGM) Special Sessions 21 & 22 March 2020 pertinent to concours judging. **Due to pervasive health concerns, the AGM essentials were conducted via teleconference rather than in person.** These comments are summarized for the sake of brevity. Since the JCNA Bylaws require the AGM to be in a physical venue, that event has been rescheduled to 21-23 AUG, 2020 in Columbia SC.

Rule Book Administrative Changes, Clarifications, Rewrites and Additions.

There were multiple problems during the 2019 Concours Season requiring JCNA Concours Rules Committee (JCRC) attention. A total review of all the rules and protocols in the Judge's Guide, and an updating and modification of the Judge's Certification Process were in order. In most cases it was accomplished by simply replacing the words "will "or "shall" with the word "must" when describing a required action to be performed. There will be no new Rule Book approval until the August 2020 AGM (For use in 2021). Thus, the existing 2019 version will be used for the 2020 Concours season.

### Judge's Test.

As a result of the many modifications and additions to the Rule Book, an updated Judge's Test will be created and will be distributed to all the Chief Judges following the AGM in August 2020. <u>After 2020, all Judges will be required to annually pass the test in order to retain their certification.</u>

**2020 Concours Judges Training.** Provided below is a summary of the three types of Concours-related training that I had offered this year. **Please RSVP** to me (either directly or via our website) at least 3 days before the class whether you plan to attend so that there will be plenty of training materials available. **Note: These training sessions have been canceled or re-structured from our normal practice as a result of ongoing public health concerns.** 

- <u>Concours 101.</u> **Cancelled** for this season due to continuing low demand and Member health considerations. One-on-One briefings for new Entrants by TELCON are available on request.
- Concours 201. Cancelled for this season for Member health considerations.
- Concours 301. The formal, annual Judges' Refresher Training is now required each year by JCNA to recertify Judges for the current concours year. It includes a briefing presentation, review of the more important aspects of the JCNA Concours Rule Book, and discussions of the Rule Book changes. The current written Judges' Test will be administered by Email. One weekend session is planned: jointly with IEJC and JOCLA Judges. Date and participant details to follow.


