



Cat Tales

"Alloy-bodied Jaguar" The phrase echoes distant racing success at Le Mans, and exotic swoopy race cars from the 50's. But nowadays a lot of cars are made of the lightweight aluminum alloy (or "aluminium" as I call it). This particular alloy-bodied Jaguar is my much-loved XJ8. It's a 2007 short wheelbase (SWB) model and realistically the best car we've ever owned. Its smooth, quiet, fast enough (almost) and gets great gas mileage. I also



like the beautiful wood and leather with the contrasting piping. Some people get attached to their car and give them cute names and tuck their kitty up at night. This one - not so much. This beautiful alloy-bodied XJ8 sits outside all the time because there's an E-Type in the garage that has claimed the space as its own. Our XJ8 has no name - it just works reliably, dependably - ready to rush all over California at a moment's notice, requiring only fresh fluids every now and then. Until recently that is, when one morning the comprehensive driver warning system said "WARNING - VEHICLE TOO LOW". Maybe the XJ8 had had enough: No cute name - too much UV - no Jaguar club drive this year - it needed attention. What can that mean I thought: Too Low? It's a lot higher than the E-Type - and the E-type is on four stands! More investigation was clearly needed. When I got out and checked it did look low - disturbingly low - like can I turn the steering wheel without scraping something? So, my low rider needed some attention to get it back up and running. Since it looked like steering might be limited, and options to get the car towed seemed complicated, I decided to work on this myself. After all - how hard can it be? ...

After reviewing the manuals, the warning is a reference to some gremlins in the air suspension system. Apparently, the car has an air compressor, reservoir, computerized distribution system, an air spring strut at each corner and remote ride height sensor. It has self-leveling and can change ride height to get closer to the ground for better aerodynamics and handling when traveling fast. There's probably more computer power devoted to this suspension system than the whole of the Apollo moon landing project. Like the moon landing, this air suspension requires an exceptional number of components to work flawlessly. This revelation that the system has air springs does explain the "floating on air" while driving on the freeway but it's not a ride - kind of a comfy / sporty compromise that works well. Except of course when the vehicle is too low.

To recap - it's a Jaguar with an alloy body, more software than a moon mission and it has an air leak somewhere. Hmmm. First thing is to research how the system works, and maybe try to understand what it's trying to tell me. Let's see - no other symptoms, maybe it's a leak, or maybe the compressor is weak. The compressor is protected from running continually to prevent overheating, so some wear in the compressor or overheating / blown fuse might explain my low rider situation. The fuses to the compressor were good. Next inspections were from underneath, and this is where the alloy body is significant. According to the manuals it is imperative that the car is lifted symmetrically to avoid twisting anything. And so, with two jacks the car was lifted 1/2 inch at a time to ensure the body wasn't subject to any twisting. Now I don't like working under cars. I might spend more time thinking about lifting the car and safely supporting than the time it takes to complete the rest of the work, but the manual does show a couple of places to put stands where there is enough strength to support the car safely. And so, it was lifted and supported - symmetrically - and only just enough to get the wheels in the air to start a good inspection.

The air compressor is behind the bumper, just in front of the left front wheel. It's easy to see once the wheel and the wheel-arch liner are removed. I decided to inspect the compressor on the bench, and while out I could replace the piston seal. Removal is straightforward. Two pipes for air - one in, one out; two electrical connectors (electric in / out?) and three nuts to support the spring-mounted assembly. The compressor is made by WABCO (Westinghouse Air Brake Company) and seal kits are readily available. Once on the bench I cleaned the compressor to prevent dust from getting inside. I removed the cylinder head and replaced the piston seal and O ring.



Re-installing the compressor was a bit more fiddley. The spring suspension system was an exercise in finger dexterity. Its required to support the weight of the compressor while at the same time hold up a bracket, spring, bush and nut - all with one hand. We found it necessary to remove the radiator splash shield for more access. Fortunately, Matt helped, and the compressor was back in place quickly. Feeling optimistic we replaced the wheel, lowered the car to the ground and started the engine. High fives all around - the car raised itself to its normal height and looks ready to go once the splash tray and liner are re-fitted.

Aside from the two-jack complication it was a straightforward procedure requiring only basic tools and maybe two hours total. Phew!!



Editor's Note: Thanks Dave for a great overview of the rebuild of your air suspension compressor. It recalled a recent episode of "Wheeler Dealers" where Ant dealt with the same problem on a Porsche Cayenne. I'm also reminded of a 1985 Lincoln I once owed that had a similar problem. I would occasionally come out in the morning and find my Continental in a "Downward Dog" yoga position. Good Job! -Ed.

Soon, our SDJC Concours Judges' cadre will begin its process to spin-up for the 2021 season. I am pleased to report that all our active Judges are currently certified as of 2020 year-end. Well done! In addition, there are three Apprentices in the training pipeline. Training in the Spring will complete re-certification for those who need to come up to date.

(Pencil) Mark your calendars for Refresher Training:

The Next JCNA Annual General Meeting (AGM) will be hosted at Jaguar Land Rover North America Headquarters in Columbia, SC on 27-28 March 2021. Decisions taken by the Delegates at that meeting affecting our concours judging procedures and rules will be reflected in updates to the Official JCNA Concours d'Elegance Rule Book and to our standard training materials which derive from it.

Refresher Training for SDJC's JCNA Certified Concours Judges, Apprentices, and Owner/Competitors will be scheduled as follows:

TBD mid-May 2021 will be Concours 301 (Judge Refresher Training) Session One at 9 AM, and Concours 101 (Concours Information for Participant Owners) beginning at 1 PM. The traditional site at the SD Auto Museum may no longer be viable due to changes to the parking availability adjacent the Museum, its operational status, cost and, of course, COVID-19 restrictions on public and group activities. ZOOM or other virtual venue is the more likely alternative this year.

TBD late June 2021 will be Concours 301 Session Two beginning at 9 AM. Same caveat as above applies to venue and format.

Concours 201 (Hands-On practice Judging for Apprentices and optional for Certified Judges) will be scheduled prior to our July concours depending on need, interest level and the above COVID-19 caveats.




