Presidential Perspective

March 2022

Two Jaguar-related events took place in February, both of which made quite an impression, at least on me. The first was a visit to the new San Diego Jaguar Land Rover facility on Miramar Road. Jim Hallameyer, our SDJC Dealer Representative, arranged a tour following discussions with David Drake, General Manager, and Michael Hames, Sales Manager. Nedra Rummell, Membership Chair, Mark Hodges, SDJC former president and concours chair, and I also participated. Details of the tour will be provided in an upcoming issue of Jaguar Tracks. I have owned Jaguars for close to 40 years and during that time have bought parts or had cars serviced at at-least six San Diego Jaguar dealerships. Hands down, this is the most impressive. It is spacious, has ample parking, and provides top-cabin service. During the tour, a couple of topics jumped out for me. There was only one Jaguar on the showroom floor.



The answer for this was explained by the very limited inventory of new Jaguars for sale. Like every other car manufacturer, Jaguar has been heavily impacted by COVID and the accompanying world-wide shortage of computer chips. The second related to Jaguar sales in general. In response to my question about sales, Michael said they had sold 7 Jags last month. Given that it is a Jaguar Land Rover facility, I asked how many Land Rovers they sold last month – 77! Yikes.

The second event a few days later was a visit to The Museum of Making Music in Carlsbad on Saturday, February 12, followed by a picnic at the nearby Poinsettia Park. See page 9 for a review of the day. This event was set up by the dynamic duo of Diah Avery, Events Chair, and Nedra. I knew what to expect of the picnic, but I had no idea what the tour of the museum would be like, never having heard of it. It turned out to be well worth the visit, with a variety of intriguing facts about instruments and demonstrations provided by the three docents. Does anyone recall the sound of a Celesta? I didn't but do now. During the tour, Jorgene and I became separated. While looking for her, I wandered down a hallway adjacent to the museum area and stumbled across a piano Honors Competition sponsored by the California Association of Professional Music Teachers. I sat down to listen for a minute or two and was awed by the talent of a 10-year-old girl playing a Bach Fugue and Debussy Deux Arabesques. I found Jorgene and we returned to hear two other contestants before returning to the tour. The talent and dedication of these young artists was amazing and made me realize why I gave up my musical career as a violinist in the 8th grade. I had neither the talent nor focus needed. With or without a musical competition, I can highly recommend a visit to the museum, if only to again understand the power of music in our lives.

Let's keep our Jags in tune, melodious and in harmony as Spring is on the way and make some music as we sing along the on the roads to upcoming Jaguar events in Southern California.







Dan Jensen reminded me of following article from Autoweek:

Jaguar Will Build Its Own EV Platform, Report Says

Panthera battery-electric architecture will underpin next generation of EVs from Jaguar.



- Jaguar will develop and build its own battery-electric platform instead of sourcing it from another automaker or supplier, Jaguar CEO tells Autocar.
- The platform, dubbed Panthera, will underpin the next generation of Jaguar electric vehicles.
- The automaker plans for all of its new vehicles to be battery-electric after 2025, but not all current models will receive next-gen EV versions.

Jaguar Land Rover CEO Thierry Bolloré revealed this week that the automaker plans to create its own EV platform in-house, *Autocar* reports, instead of acquiring one from a supplier or another automaker as had been planned earlier. Dubbed Panthera, the EV platform will underpin several electric Jaguar models, with the automaker seeking to avoid sharing major components or vehicle shapes with other automakers.

"Concerning the new Jaguar, we're making unique proportion a priority. That's the reason why at the moment we do it by ourselves," Bolloré told *Autocar*.

Jaguar rolled out its electrification strategy, dubbed Reimagine, last February, aiming to introduce only new battery-electric models starting in 2025, ahead of corporate sibling Land Rover. At the time Jaguar indicated that one of its future EV platforms would be the Electric Modular Architecture (EMA) architecture, and which would underpin a number of midsize electric SUVs, as well as Land Rover models.

"Land Rover will use the forthcoming flex Modular Longitudinal Architecture (MLA)," the automaker noted last February in introducing its Reimagine strategy. "It will deliver electrified internal combustion engines (ICE) and full electric variants as the company evolves its product line-up in the future. In addition, Land Rover will also use pure electric biased Electric Modular Architecture (EMA) which will also support advanced electrified ICE."

Not all current Jaguar models are expected to survive the transition to an all-EV lineup, as Jaguar hinted earlier. The XE and XF sedans are expected to merge into one sedan offering, which could be a midsize sedan. Meanwhile, longer-term plans for a range-topping sedan remain murky, as Jaguar had canceled a Tesla Model S competitor whose design and engineering were basically completed, making the decision to shelve it at the last minute.

The E-Pace and F-Pace models, meanwhile, are currently expected to receive battery-electric successors once their production cycles reach their end points. A sports car is expected to remain in the lineup, with the F-Type receiving coupe and cabrio versions with BEV underpinnings. The I-Pace, on the other hand, may end up being redundant and not receive a direct replacement, despite being Jaguar's first battery-electric model.

Speaking of the I-Pace, this model has not been a sales leader for Jaguar in recent years, to put it mildly, despite enjoying a relatively early debut among EV models from European automakers. Given the fact that the model is built by Magna Steyr and its platform is not currently shared with other JLR models, it's possible it won't receive a direct replacement.

"By the middle of the decade, Jaguar will have undergone a renaissance to emerge as a pure electric luxury brand with a dramatically beautiful new portfolio of emotionally engaging designs and pioneering next-generation technologies," the automaker said during the introduction of its Reimagine strategy last winter. "Jaguar will exist to make life extraordinary by creating dramatically beautiful automotive experiences that leave its customers feeling unique and rewarded."

Concours Judges Training

Preparations have begun for our 58th Concours being held at Spanish Landing Park on Saturday July 9th. Thank you to Mark Hodges, our Concours Chair for doing the many tasks it takes to make our event happen! With four local Concours this year we still need volunteers to become new judges. Below is a summary of the Concours-related training offered this year.

• The formal, annual Judges' Refresher Training is required each year by JCNA to recertify Judges for the current concours year. It includes a presentation, a review of the more important aspects of the JCNA Concours Rule Book, and discussions of the Rule Book changes for 2022. The written 2022 Judges' Test will be available. Everyone is welcome to attend. This is an excellent way for Judges and Entrants to learn more about JCNA Concours Rules. This year's training will be virtual via Zoom on March 26th.

• Hands on judging of Jaguars using official score sheets, JCNA Concours Rule Books and JCNA Judge's Guides. This is ideal for Apprentices and anyone else wishing to brush up a bit on concours judging processes. This is also a great opportunity to bring your own Jaguar for some non-competitive insight, or get opinions on must-fix items. This will be a real in-person event at Nedra Rummell's home. It was originally scheduled for April 9th, but that now clashes with the Rolling British Car Day. Instead it will now be held April 16th, which is Easter weekend. I hope the new days works - it should be fun!



SDJC Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

February 9, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 6:33 pm via Zoom video conference by Dan Jensen, President. Officers present: Dave Allen, Mark Hodges, Chuck Leuthen, Diah Avery, Nedra Rummell and Ann Howe. Directors present: Tim Bennett, Dave Putnam, and Al Steele.

Secretary's Report: The minutes of the January 12, 2022 meeting were approved via e-mail. There was discussion regarding whether or not changes made to the minutes after the meeting should be reflected in the minutes or should the minutes reflect only what happened during the meeting. The current standard of procedure is that changes can be made if it is a follow-up and decided within a week after the meeting. Any significant changes or alterations should not be recorded in the minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Dave reported that income for January was \$10,665.00 comprising \$9,380.00 for Club Dues, \$1.080.00 for Jag Tracks advertising (China Auto Group, Jags Unlimited and Coventry Cars), and \$195.00 for the Museum of Making Music tour. Expenses for January were \$6,051.29 comprising Bank fees (\$147.30), JCNA dues paid on behalf of club member (\$5,400.00), Online processing fee to the Port Authority for the Concours d'Elegance (\$35.00), Payment to the Museum of Making Music (\$220.00, Affiliate membership of the Coventry Foundation (\$100.00), monthly storage facility fees (\$132.00) payments for the web site and Zoom (\$16.99). Overall, there was a net income of \$4,603.71 for the month, almost entirely through 2022 membership dues.

First Vice President Activities Report: Nedra reviewed the January Windmill Drive event. Diah updated the upcoming events:

- February 12, 2022: Museum of Making Music and Picnic 47 people have signed up. Nedra to call the Museum with final total of attendees. She will bring directions from the museum to the park for participants. She also obtained the permit from the city for the use of the park.
- March 12, 2022: Meet and Eat by the Lake Registration is open. After discussion, it was decided to leave the payments going to Dan instead of directly to Dave as the organizer needs to know how many and who are attending. To date 47 people are signed up.
- April 9, 2022: Dave P. confirmed the date of the Rolling British Car Day
- May: Diah suggested a possible event at Cabrillo Monument. It's an excellent place for pictures of the cars overlooking the lighthouse. Dan suggested she contact Terry Tilton, Secretary of the San Diego Auto Museum. A flyer will be needed. There is a flyer for the Point Loma Road Rally, May 7th in the most recent Tracks page 23. Perhaps this can be updated.
- June 11, 2022: Nothing confirmed yet. Jorge Rodriquez may be able to sponsor us at a winery where he is a member. Diah to reach out to him.
- July 9, 2022: SDJC Concours at Spanish Landing. Mark and Dave A. are coordinating this event.
- August 13, 2022: Concours Afterglow at Rancho Santa Fe Golf Club. Dave P. will sponsor this event again this year, and Diah will work directly with the club.
- September: Nothing planned yet. A drive was suggested maybe an overnighter. Nedra offered to help with the drive.
- October 8, 2022: British Car Day at Spanish Landing.
- November 12, 2022: SDJC Election Luncheon. Diah will reach out to see if we can be sponsored into the Silver Gate Yacht Club.
- December 2022: SDJC Holiday Party. Diah and Nedra are looking into several venues, including the Bali Ha'i, Tom Ham's Lighthouse and the Kona Kai.
- Nedra offered to do research on the CalClubs Reunion 2022 Solvang event as she will be going there in March. Dave offered to help with looking for hotels in Solvang on one of his trips to San Luis Obispo.

There was discussion regarding how important the drives are to members. Also, it would be good to have a way to retain driving instructions for the routes of past drives. The goal is to add these to the SDJC website.

Second Vice President Membership Report: Nedra reported there were no new members for February. We have had 14 renewals since our last meeting, making us nearly 24% ahead of this time last year. She provided an updated roster and will give Dave A. an income report for \$630 in checks on Saturday.

Newsletter Editor Report: Chuck requested a recap from Nedra on the Museum of Making Music event. He will do a recap on the Long Beach Maya Hotel Show and Shine which is being put on by Mark Mayuga. The annual financial statement will also be included in the March Jaguar Tracks. He asked for an updated calendar of events for the Tracks. Also, he needs a flyer for the Rolling British Car Day event.

Webmaster: Mark has been working on updating the website. He has added Nedra's updated directory. Everything is up-to-date.

Functional Chair Reports:

Advertising: Dan reported year-to-date sales of is \$2,880 and we have received \$1,440. Two advertisers have not yet paid. Dan will send out reminder letters if needed.

Auto Museum Representative: Dan received a note from Pete Pickslay which said "Dan: Nothing new of interest at the museum. They are going all out fundraising for the big new addition and that's not new."

British Car Club Council Representative: Dave P. reported Rolling British Car Day will end up at the Bates Nut Farm. There will be north and south starting points as was done in prior years. It will be a bring-your-own picnic lunch as they don't have the facilities to feed all of us.

The British Car Day at Spanish Landing will be in October.

Concours: Mark will be working with Dave A. on the portable restroom rental fee and will determine the preferred option. He's also thinking about lowering the vehicle display fee from \$20 to \$10 per car. The reasoning behind this is that \$10 it would be about the same cost as the metered parking and would provide an incentive for other Jaguar owners to park in the display area. The board agreed this was a good idea. This event is already sanctioned on the JCNA website so Mark will post the flyer and open up registration this weekend. The display area will be limited to Jaguars. The Port changed its policy to eliminate support vehicles from parking on the grass. Mark will note this on his flyer.

Mark pointed out the cost of \$700 to have the DJ provide power and music for our events. Mark researched solar generators, which come with lithium-ion batteries that hold a charge all day. The generators come with solar panels which, when connected, will keep the batteries topped off during the time of use. He has confirmed that the power provided (1,000 watts) is more than enough to run music and announcements at any of our events. There are two brands: Jackery at the price of \$1,500 and Generark at \$1,450. The cost for the purchase would be recuperated in about two years. Dave A. questioned if the club's storage has sufficient room to house the generator. Mark stated the generator is approximately 10"X10"x15" and 20 to 30 pounds and stated there is ample storage space. Mark made a motion to purchase a Jackery or Generark generator. Dave A. seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Property Manager: See Concours above.

Chief Judge: Dave A. stated that due to a conflict of dates, the Zoom Judges' Virtual Training will be moved to a different day. Nedra will host the Judges' training at her home on April 16. Dave will lock down the date for the virtual training and make a flyer for a potential email blast. He will reach out to current judges with dates. He will also reach out to potential new judges. Dave requested the new e-mail address of <u>ChiefJudge@SDJagClub.com</u> be linked to his home e-mail address.

Dealer Rep: Jim set up a visit to tour the new facility of Jaguar Land Rover San Diego for Thursday, February 10, at noon. Michael Hames, Sales Manager, and David Drake, General Manager, will be there. Nedra will give them an honorary membership to SDJC.

Raffles / Roster / Awards: Nedra reported she will need the Tuescher trophy and Member of the Year engraving plates to add the 2021 winners. She will contact Tom Krefetz and ask for a picture of his car.

Old Business:

- Use of social media Nedra has been able to post a few things on social media as some of what she posts personally goes directly to the SDJC Facebook page. She has been prohibited from posting directly on the SDJC Facebook page as she is not set up as an administrator. Allie Proctor has the User ID and password for the Instagram page. Liz is to obtain that information from Allie so she can post on that account. Nedra will send material to Liz for the posts. Others (Cadillac, BMW, etc.) have been posting on our Facebook page. These posts need to be removed but can't be until Nedra receives the administrator's access. JCNA is focusing on social media to lure younger people toward Jaguar.
- Meeting with Jaguar San Diego see Dealer Rep report above.
- Article in Tracks re Member access to Bylaws, etc. There will be an article in the March Jaguar Tracks to clear up the problem some members are having regarding how to access the bylaws, etc.
- **SDJC COVID Policy** Al recommended we take a vote to see if the BOD thought there was a need for a specific COVID policy for SDJC. Nedra stated that JCNA currently has no policy for COVID in place. After discussion, the consensus of the board was that SDJC does not need a specific COVID policy but should follow the current requirements of the state, cities and venues.

New Business:

• AGM Delegate: This year the JCNA Annual General Meeting will be held March 24-27 in Milwaukee. Since Nedra plans to attend and will be presenting the Membership Committee Report, as well as the Passport to Service Report, she offered to represent SDJC as a delegate. There was a motion by Chuck that Nedra should represent SDJC at AGM. The motion was seconded by Dave A. After discussion it was determined that expenses, for registration and awards dinner, likely under \$200, should also be paid by SDJC. Motion passed.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:56 pm by Dan. The next meeting will be March 9 at 6:30 pm by Zoom video meeting.
