





When Bill and I were asked to introduce ourselves at one of the luncheons, I must admit we both went into a bit of "panic mode". We are very proud of our beautiful car, but we're not too used to talking about it. But I guess this is the place where we can brag a bit about our remarkable red beauty!





I feel fortunate to have grown up with a car enthusiast. My father has owned many incredible automobiles over his lifetime. One of his favorites was his brand new 1965 Jaguar XKE. But if you were to ask me, my favorite would have to be his 1976 XJ6C (the last year of the coupe). It was signal red, and it was the car I most remember from my childhood. I was only 6 years old when we drove it off the lot; but I'll never forget that day.



My parents were part of the Jaguar club here in San Diego and I attended many of the Concours d' Elegance events. I also was taught at an early age how to clean a whitewall if my mom got a little too close to the curb! Growing up with such an outstanding car, it was always my dream to drive a red Jag just like my mom. So, when the opportunity presented itself, we knew we had to jump on it.

A friend's parents made the painful decision to part with their beloved Jaguar. We had heard about this special edition car and the fact that there were 18 made for the US. When we found out it was red, we knew it was fate.

We did some research and learned as much as we possibly could about this 2011 XKR Poltrona Frau Limited Edition Coupe.

Ian Callum was a Scottish car designer. He became the Director of Design for Jaguar from 1999-2019. So here is the story of our car.

"The 2011 XKR Poltrona Frau Limited Edition in salsa red with black pack is one of only 18 cars in Ian Callum's personal color combination.

Jaguar North America commissioned a special run of 18 cars with the Poltrona Frau leather headliner. Each one is an XKR Coupe in a very special color combination available exclusively on these cars.

What makes this combination so special is that it is not just exclusive to these cars, but it is Jaguar head designer Ian Callum's personal specification for his own XKR Coupe. To own a car in the preferred color combination of the car's designer is certainly very special. Two of these 18 cars were initially held by Jaguar North America for special events, meaning only 16 were initially available for retail sale."

Our goal now is to find out which number of the limited edition our car is. We have spoken to many people and feel like we are on the right path to track down the information.

But it's not really the number that makes this car special to me – it's the feeling I get every time I get behind the wheel. Now I understand the pride and joy my mom felt with her Jag for so many years.

There's just something special about a Jaguar (limited edition or not).





Quite often this feature is nothing more than simple trivia, factoids and my lame attempt at humor. Not this time! The following letter from Mark Hodges is most important. Please give it your thoughtful attention and consideration. - Chuck

Open Letter to All San Diego Jaguar Club Members

Those of you who were at the Election Luncheon and the Holiday Party heard that the Hodges family is moving to the Newport coast next year, and I don't mean the California Newport coast. As such, the position of Webmaster, Concours Chair, and Property Manager are open, and folks needs to step up and take over. Before I write about what a Webmaster and Concours Chair do, I'll tell you how I got the jobs and then go into why you should volunteer to take over one of the positions.

When my Webmaster predecessor moved out of state, word went out for a volunteer to replace him. I thought about it, but decided to let someone else step up because I was not convinced I was ready to take on that responsibility. Later, I decided I was ready; nothing changed, I just thought I could handle it. My only experience with websites was I had just built a Cub Scout Pack website and realized it wasn't that hard. The Pack had been using a generic platform, which I hated, so I switched to a host called 'Scoutlander', which specialized in scouting websites. What I really liked was all of the back pages were already made; all I had to do was to fill in the blanks.

Our two previous SDJC website hosts also used generic platforms and we had to build everything from scratch. I hated them too. Jump to the present. Our current host, Wild Apricot, specializes in websites for social clubs; the website platforms are designed for membership and events, which fits our needs perfectly. We don't have to build anything; it is already there. All we have to do is pick what we want to use and fill in those blanks. I say 'we' not 'I' because I don't have to do everything myself anymore. The site is designed for multiple account administrators who have different levels of account access. Dave Allen has admin access to the financial side, Nedra Rummell has admin access to the membership side, Diah Avery has admin access to the events side, and Chuck Leuthen has admin access to the Jaguar Tracks side; they all handle the tasks associated with those positions. Directors and other elected officers have admin view access to all pages. So, running this website is truly a group effort, and the burden does not fall onto one person's shoulders. Wild Apricot has a tutorial video or pdf for pretty much any question we might have. While I feel FAQ pages on many websites are garbage (they pose questions they like, not what their customers want), Wild Apricot poses real questions with real answers on how to perform pretty much any task. I am still learning, but I have found all the answers to my questions by either clicking the 'Support' tab or calling tech support. The site is web based, so we can work on the site from any computer where there is internet access. I have edited the website from my home computer, from my work computer, and from my laptop when traveling. I don't even log on every day; it is all about time management. Whoever you are who becomes Webmaster, you do not need to be a tech geek, know the tech acronyms, or understand what they mean or what they do; I certainly do not. Anytime I spout one out is because I just looked it up to find out what it meant. What you must have is the dedication to succeed and make this work, not because it is a burden, but because you have pride in accomplishing something positive for the club.

I don't even remember how I got roped into being the Concours Chair since I had only been to a few Concourses before then, but apparently, I said, "Okay", because here I am. The first thing I realized is ya'll really like the Spanish Landing Park location. The second thing I realized is we rented most everything except for the canopies, which meant money went out every year with nothing to show for it. So we bought our own tables, chairs, sound system, portable power system, etc. These items paid for themselves in only a few years. Tim Bennet donated custom logo table covers and canopies. These changes put us on the map as one of the premier Concours car shows around. The pre-planning (location, portable restroom reservations, etc.) starts many months in advance, and different tasks have different timelines so everything is not bunched up close to showtime. The website makes registration a breeze; it is not complicated at all (the secret here is you can copy last year's Concours into a new event and all you have to do is change the specifics in the entry boxes. Shhh; don't tell anyone it is that easy). The most time-consuming task is filling in and printing the windshield placards and scoresheets. That task is much easier now that we have a fillable pdf program where all I do is type in the personal identifying info in the appropriate box, hit print, and voila - instant windshield placards and scoresheets. Ever notice other club's placards and scoresheets? Sorry, but they look like crap: handwritten and only partially filled out. It is actually more work for them with less results; most inefficient.

The Property Manager mostly deals with the equipment needed for the Concours. A good property manager has access to a truck, van, and/or trailer to transport the supplies to the Concours. The secret is this: a little extra pre-planning on the front end makes success on the back end much easier. Every time I pull something off, I really do say to myself, "Wow, that actually worked."

Now, about you stepping up to fill one of these positions. If a club officer thinks you would be a good fit and asks you to volunteer for one of these positions, please consider it. If you think you would be a good fit, let me or any club officer know. Ask questions, watch a few tutorial videos, meet with me so I can personally show you the back pages of the website and the admin side of the Concours. While we do need people to come to these events as participants, someone has to organize them. Do what I did: take what someone else built, put your own stamp on it, and modify it to match your own personality.

We won't be leaving until mid-year, so the sooner you get on board, the longer the overlap, and the more I will be able to mentor you. Until our next event, take care...
