# Drive and Lunch - San Vicente Golf Resort

Jorgene and I have stayed at the San Vicente Golf Resort in Ramona numerous times over the past few years. Not only is it a short 45-minute drive for us from home, our route there takes us through the Barona Indian Reservation with its beautiful backcountry scenery. In addition, the drive on Wildcat Canyon Road really allows our Cats to purr along. As COVID passed, we began to plan a club drive and luncheon buffet at the Resort based on our many pleasant experiences there. As we started the plan, we decided it would be best if we used two routes: a southern route starting near University City and a northern route starting at North County Fair, a frequent gathering spot for club drives over the past year. We knew that both routes had great scenery over stretches of open landscape and hills. As mentioned in the March-April Jaguar Tracks Presidential Perspective, Jorgene and I called or left a message with virtually every SDJC member that has a listed phone. Not only did this help with attendance, it provided us with numerous pleasant conversations with members we know, some we haven't seen in some time, and others we haven't met, i.e., just about everyone who answered their phone.

The weather up to the day of the event was typical for this year in California – unusually wet (much needed) and cool. Fortunately, on the morning of the drive, the skies were clear as predicted, with plenty of sunshine. Jorgene and I opted to lead those taking the southern route and Chuck and Kathy Leuthen agreed to lead those on the northern route. After gathering at each starting location for ~45 minutes of car talk, the two groups totaling 57 participants headed out on the drives. I was a bit concerned about seasonal streams and residual rainwater on the road on the Barona Reservation since there are two locations where it can be "no-go" after heavy rains. Fortunately, other than a few puddles along the way, the roads were dry. The same was true for those on the northern route.

As a result of good planning or, more likely, good fortune, the two groups converged at the Resort at the 1:00 p.m. planned arrival time. Once there, we headed inside for libations and then the Italian buffet luncheon: Caesar Salad, Chicken Parmesan, Buttered Fettuccini Pasta, Marinara Sauce, Parmesan Cheese, Garlic Bread, and Dessert, with seconds for those so included. I can still taste it all! Service by Joyce and her staff of Denise, Gwen, and Devon was outstanding. While a few of us considered staying overnight, the cool weather was a strong incentive to return home.














# **JCNA Annual General Meeting**

# Burlingame, California March 10 -12, 2023 Report and pictures by Dave Allen

This was my first JCNA Annual General Meeting, and it was a lot of fun!

The meeting was hosted by the Jaguar Associate Group of San Francisco and held in Burlingame, CA on the waterfront just opposite San Francisco Airport. I drove up from San Diego in the trusty Jaguar XJ8, stopping in San Luis Obispo and Carmel-by-the Sea. The weather deteriorated rapidly enroute to Burlingame, with impressive wind and rain. Fortunately, traffic was reasonably light, and I arrived mid-afternoon on Thursday. The weather featured highly over the weekend, with many flights delayed for attendees.

The AGM was organized into fun trips on Friday, with the main AGM Meetings on Saturday. There was also a Jaguars by the Bay car show on Saturday and awards banquet.

Friday activities comprised a bay cruise in the morning. The weather cooperated and the sun came out for a while. Considering this was a very stormy weekend, we were extremely lucky. The afternoon event was a visit to the Mozart Foundation Auto Museum in Palo Alto. This is a private museum usually not open to the public. The collection includes over 100 historic vehicles, including cars from the Brass era, a Rolls-Royce Silver Ghost, several Bugattis from the 1930s, multiple Alfa Romeos, a Ferrari 250 GTO & 275 GT/S and a very original Jaguar XKSS!

Friday evening's banquet was a great excuse to mingle, chat and enjoy the company of other Jaguar enthusiasts.

The morning meeting was a general session, with afternoon breakouts for the Concours Rule Book and Coventry Foundation. Club delegates from SDJC (those with voting rights) were Dave Allen and Nedra Rummell. Also in attendance from our club was Pete Reith and Martin & Diah Avery and Tom Wright. As can be seen on the following pages, there were plenty of photo opportunities over the three days. Following that is a recap of the main meeting and breakout sessions.

There were some very well-presented cars and the weather "almost" co-operated at the Jaguars by the Bay Car Show. It was dry enough to use a paper ballot, but wet and windy enough to keep the convertibles closed. "Most hardy" entrant must have been George Barry in his open C-Type replica! Best of Show was awarded to Phil Endliss with his wonderful 1966 Mark 10 Saloon in Two-Tone Green.

The Awards Banquet was sponsored by SNG Barratt & Motorcars Incorporated. The feature presentation was by Boris Guzman and his epic adventure on the 7th Peking to Paris Rally in an E-Type. The car was modified extensively for the 36-day rally covering approximately 8,500 miles. What a trip! It puts my 1,135-mile weekend into perspective!

My first AGM was the best ever! I got a great insight into the workings of JCNA and really appreciate the work done by the leadership behind the scenes. Jaguar Associate Group did a tremendous job putting the event together and despite the weather, a good time was had by all.

#### **Recap of the AGM Main Meeting and Breakout Sessions**

Phil Endliss from the Host Club opened the meeting, welcoming all the delegates.

Minutes for the prior AGM were approved.

JCNA Financial Status - Bill Beible

The financial section prompted a lively debate. The main focus for discussion was the Jaguar Journal: It's a major cost to the club and the paper, printing, and mailing costs are projected to continue to increase. The JCNA Board of Directors are still reviewing options to address the issue, and presented several scenarios analyzed as part of the five-year financial plan. The scenarios presented included dues increases and variations in paper quality for the Jaguar Journal. Overwhelming opinion from the floor was to reduce costs, move to a more digital format and refrain from excessive dues increases. This was a civilized debate, but the agenda item ran long due to recommendations from the delegates. The Board of Directors seemed to understand the mood and acknowledged there was still some work to go before any decisions would be made.

One item of note: The option to receive Jaguar Journal in digital copy only via the Zinio service was picked up by a very small minority of the members, only 40-50 out of 4,300 members. The Board interpreted this as a signal that the vast majority of members prefer (and would therefore pay for) a physical paper magazine. Delegates from the floor offered that this was an information issue. Each club offered to remind their members of the Zinio option for a digital magazine. (Personal note: I opted for Zinio service a few weeks ago.)

Election Committee - Lisa Schafer

The following were unanimously re-elected to the position of Regional Director - for the 2023 – 2025 (2-year) Term of Office:

- Dean Cusano (JCSNE) North-East Region
- Craig Kerins (JCCNF) South-East Region
- Gary Cunningham (JAGM) North-Central Region replaced Mike Meyer
- J.J. Keig (JOANT) South-Central Region
- Brian Case (SJC) North-West Region replaced Kurt Jacobson
- Les Hamilton (JAG) South-West Region

There were no opposing nominations for President, and John Boswell was re-elected for a 4<sup>th</sup> term through 2024.

There was a competitive election held for position of Vice-president for 2023-2024. Candidates were Mark Mayuga and J.J Keig. After the paper ballots were counted, J.J. was declared the new Vice President.

#### Membership Committee Report - Mark Mayuga/Nedra Rummell

The report focused on the need to attract and retain new members, potentially younger members due to the many good value sports cars available. More presence on social network will be required. These initiatives are being developed further as part of the new JCNA Marketing Committee. Kurt Jacobson will be leading the Marketing Committee and Nedra Rummell was asked to serve due to her affiliation with the Membership Committee and Passport to Service Committee.

Publicity, Social Media, Facebook, etc. - Les Hamilton

This item was skipped. Les Hamilton was unable to attend the session due to the bad weather and home emergencies.

#### IJFs and AGMs

The 2024 AGM will be held in Charlotte, North Carolina, March 14-17.

Details are still being developed, but activities will likely include a visit to the NASCAR Hall of Fame.

The location of the 2024 IJF is still undecided.

Nedra will propose a motion to the SDJC board that we host the AGM in San Diego in 2025.

Mark Mayuga presented a summary of the 2023 IJF to be held in Santa Barbara, October 29 through November 1. Events will include a Visit to the Petersen Museum, Canyon drive, Concours d'Elegance, Slalom, Rally, Banquets and a "whodunit" costume party.

#### Concours

Jim Sanbold, Concours Committee Chair, summarized the 2022 season. There were 35 Concours events. There were several areas where "we could do better" in terms of judging and administering the Concours. The list of improvements were all items covered by the rule book, which is both disappointing and also reassuring that appropriate guidance is available. My takeaway (as San Diego Chief Judge) was Chief Judges need to be more familiar with the rules, especially for Judge certification.

Hal Kritzman, JCNA Chief Judge, explained the rationale for the comprehensive Rule Book update for 2023, i.e., basically to improve consistency and remove ambiguity. Also shown was a glimpse of the new Chief Judge test. Only a couple of questions were shown, but the intention was to get a feeling from the AGM delegates whether the Chief Judge test was a seen as a good idea. Unanimous support was shown, so Hal will continue to develop the test for use in 2024 onwards.

Steve Kennedy, Concours Rule Book Editor, gave a brief overview of the recommended changes to 2023 Concours Rule Book. There are a total of 116 pages, most of which are clarifications with no substantive changes to the rules. The changes were approved with a show of hands from the floor.

There was a short discussion on the website interface for Chief Judges to upload scores. It was acknowledged to be "clunky" and need improvement. One or two people offered useful tips to help speed up the process.

#### Breakout Session: Concours & Rule Book

We discussed a JCNA Judge Training presentation, which was prepared originally by SDJC. We were recognized as a major contributor, with inputs from Dick Cavicke, Paul Novak, Pete Reith, Mark Hodges and Dave Allen.

There were some enthusiastic discussions over rules, about update frequency, and if too many rules remove the fun. Ultimately it was agreed that rules are necessary to achieve the JCNA aim of consistent scoring across the country. One prolonged discussion was focused on red-line tires, and if they should be considered eligible for Driven Class. They are non-authentic in Champion Class because they were never offered by Jaguar. The conclusion, after a long discussion, was they should be considered non-authentic in Driven Class also. Expect a rule change on this in the future.

The group also discussed the best way to organize judging teams. It's actually a very complex exercise to match judge experience with the cars, while avoiding conflicts of interest (judging own car for example), and also having an efficient judging schedule. Having done this myself, it's difficult. Fortunately, there is a software program to help and available via Janet Sowell at Pony Tech Solutions. We discussed the software and other ways to make the Concours easier to administer.

#### Breakout Session: Coventry Foundation

Tom Wright, Nedra Rummell, Dean Cusano, Eric Dunn reviewed CF areas of responsibility, including Publications, Technical Line, JCNA Trophy Management, Tool Loan Program, JCNA Regalia, and Authenticity. All agreed, club members should be reminded of the vast resources available through the Coventry Foundation. For instance, there is now a World Diagnostic System available at Country Foundation West, located at Classic Showcase, as well as expansive tool loan wall and extensive library of manuals, books, and magazines.

**The Mission Inn**, now known as The Mission Inn Hotel & Spa, is a historic landmark hotel in downtown Riverside, California. Although a composite of many architectural styles, it is generally considered the largest Mission Revival Style building in the United States. Mission Inn Hotel & Spa is a member of Historic Hotels of America, the official program of the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

For 120 years, the Mission Inn has been the center of Riverside, host to U.S. Presidents, celebrities, a number of seasonal and holiday functions, as well as occasional political functions and other major social gatherings. Pat and Richard Nixon were married in what is now the Presidential Lounge, Nancy and Ronald Reagan honeymooned there, and eight other U.S. presidents have visited the inn: Benjamin Harrison, William McKinley, Theodore Roosevelt, William Howard Taft, Herbert Hoover, John Fitzgerald Kennedy, Gerald Ford, and George W. Bush.

Social leaders who have stopped at the Mission Inn include Susan B. Anthony, Henry Ford, Andrew Carnegie, John D. Rockefeller, Henry Huntington, Albert Einstein, Joseph Pulitzer, William Randolph Hearst, Hubert H. Bancroft, Harry Chandler, Booker T. Washington, Helen Keller, John Muir as well as Chuck & Kathy Leuthen. (Just checking to see if you were actually reading this stuff.)

Kathy and I didn't make the drive from its starting location in Brea for this Southern California Jaguar Clubs Regional Event but rather drove directly to the Inn where we met up with the arrivals from the west. 

















# Notes from the Concours Judge's Tent


# May - June 2023 By Dave Allen, Chief Judge, San Diego Jaguar Club

### **Spare Parts and Such from Chuck Leuthen**



Two completely unrelated subjects from my desk in this issue. The first is an on-line article that summarizes emails conversations and shared internet blogs between Tim Bennett, Dan Jensen and me that points to Jaguar Land Rover's future.

### Defender, Range Rover, and Discovery Will Join Jaguar as Standalone Brands

Here's what we want to see from each of them.

Defender: The Off-Road Warrior

Discovery: The Mainstream Family Brand
 Range Rover: Premium Meets Luxury
 Jaguar: An Electric Porsche Rival

As part of a broader electrification announcement yesterday, Jaguar Land Rover revealed that Land Rover was to be dropped as a brand, with the focus squarely on Range Rover, Defender, Discovery, and Jaguar as its four core nameplates.

This will bring to an end a 75-year history of the Land Rover brand, although it officially only became an automaker in 1978.

"Pivotal to our Reimagine strategy is the formation of the House of Brands, which is a natural evolution, with a purpose of elevating and amplifying the uniqueness of our characterful British marques," said Chief Creative Officer Prof. Gerry McGovern. "Our ultimate ambition is to build truly emotionally engaging experiences for our clients that, over time, will build long-term high equity for our brands and long-term sustainability for JLR."

But what can we expect from each brand? And perhaps more importantly, what will it take for each brand to succeed?



### **Jaguar: An Electric Porsche Rival**

With the XE and XF, Jaguar failed to rival BMW. The products were good but lacked the polish and refinement of the Germans. The XJ was always fun to drive, but it fell out of touch with the industry. When the electric XJ replacement was shelved, things started looking dire for the brand. The I-Pace was good but has since been usurped by just about everyone, meaning Jaguar relies too heavily on the F-Pace (a great rival to the Porsche Macan) and the aging F-Type sports car.

The latter two will arguably dictate where the brand goes now, and we see it becoming a rival to Porsche as it transitions to an all-electric brand.

As part of the announcement, Jaguar confirmed its next electric model would be a four-door electric GT car - similar to the Porsche Panamera - with up to 430 miles of electric range and more power than any previous Jaguar. That means more than the 592-horsepower XE SV Project 8.

The new \$120,000 model will be built on a new electric architecture called JEA (Jaguar Electric Architecture) and will begin deliveries in 2025, followed by two more "reimagined Jaguars."



### **Call to Order / Attendance:**

The Meeting was called to order at 6:31 pm via Zoom Video Conference by the Club President. The officers present were Dan Jensen, President; Nedra Rummell, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Membership; Dave Allen, Treasurer & Chief Judge; James Waite, Secretary; Chuck Leuthen, Newsletter Editor; Matt Allen, Webmaster; Al Steele, Director; Dave Putnam, Director & British Car Club Council Representative; Tim Bennett, Director; Terry Tilton, Director & Auto Museum Representative; Marie Allen, Historian; and Mark Hodges, Concours Chair.

### **Board Reports:**

- Secretary's Report: James reported that the Minutes of the February 8, 2023 meeting were approved via e-mail. The Minutes of February were forwarded to Chuck for inclusion in the newsletter. There was no Board of Directors meeting in March of 2023 and hence no Minutes.
- Treasurer's Report: Dave Allen reported the following:
- For February, the month activities include income of \$2,955.00 comprising \$1,685.00 received for Club Dues, \$30.00 for Logo Items and \$1,240.00 for the San Vincente Golf Club Luncheon. For April, Nedra reported that she has continued working on this event. She contacted more than five venues and was shocked at their prices. Fortunately, we have a large base of members that enjoy our events, which is good, but finding a private space is becoming more and more difficult. For the Member Appreciation, Election, Concours and Holiday event, we need a large private space which increases the costs. For next year, it was discussed we may have the Member Appreciation Luncheon at the San Vicente Golf Course or alternatively, we could combine the Election Luncheon and the New Member Luncheon to reduce the cost. She provided a list of all the venues she visited with notes explaining why they won't work this year. After an exhaustive search, Nedra reported that her recommendation is have the event at the Butcher Shop. They are under new ownership and have a new chef who she met and who is her personal contact for the event. We will have the entire parking lot to park our cars. We will be using their private dining room which accommodates 100 diners which will give us plenty of room. There is a bar in the room, and they will have staff to take orders. They have four meal options which range in price from \$52 to \$91 per meal. After being presented with the information, it was discussed whether to have the luncheon at The Butcher Shop, which meal option to choose and whether or not to have the club supplement the cost of the meal. A Motion to have the luncheon at The Butcher Shop, to choose the large group lunch option at \$52 per meal and to have the club provide a supplement for a final cost of \$40.00 per meal was submitted by Nedra, seconded by Dave Allen and approved unanimously.
- As to the Leapers and Lasagna event set for June 10 Dan reported that Bob and Ali Proctor have agreed to host an Italian luncheon on June 10, 2023 at a location TBD in the Carlsbad, CA area. Nedra will follow-up with the Proctor's to finalize the details. Chuck requested an event flyer for Jag Tracks.
- As to the Concours Afterglow set for August 26 Dave Putnam reported that due to a conflict, the date of the event has changed from August 12 to August 26. The location is still at the Rancho Santa Fe Golf Club. Nedra reported she is working on the menu and will report back.
- As to the International Jaguar Festival set for October 29 to November 1 in Santa Barbara, CA Nedra reported that she will be serving as Co-Chair with Mark Mayuga for the event. He asked her to take the lead for registration and the first night cocktail party. Nedra had a meeting at the AGM with the Chair of the 2022 IJF and asked for their guidelines before scheduling a committee meeting.
- As to the Annual Election Luncheon set for November 11 the event has been set for November 11, 2023 at the San Diego Yacht Club. Al and Kathleen Steele will sponsor the event. Al has contacted the club, confirmed the date and the availability of the upstairs room that holds 80. The set-up of the room, bar service and food service would be similar to prior years. A minimum expenditure of \$1,500 and \$375 deposit is required. It was agreed to proceed and reserve the room.

- As to the Activities Committee re: Holiday Party set for December A specific date and location for the party is yet to be determined. Nedra reported that we need to book a venue very soon. She has made a list of volunteers and will contact them this week to set up a meeting to get this started. It was discussed whether or not the club should supplement the cost of the Holiday Party meal as the club has done in prior years.
- As to the Annual General Meeting set for March 10 to March 12 Nedra was our delegate and David
  was our alternate delegate. Both attended and had a wonderful time. We thank them for going and
  proudly representing our club.
- Membership Report 2<sup>nd</sup> VP, Membership: Nedra reported via email the following:
- As to new members Since our February meeting, we have had six new memberships, as well as a few more renewals as a result of the snail mail renewal reminder. The new members are Peter Georgiou, Bruce Jamieson, Ed Gentile, Susan and Robert Petersen (a family membership), George Sterns and Nicholas Konoske. A Motion to Accept the six new members was submitted by Nedra, seconded by Chuck and approved unanimously.
- As to Annual Membership Audit Since the JCNA renewal deadline has passed, it's time for the annual audit. Nedra has printed the Roster, SDJC website membership listing, Directory, Ownership Directory and JCNA submission report (225 printed pages). She has reviewed them all for consistency and updated as required. She has also checked each member's profile on the website and will update. The update of the directory has taken longer than expected, but she has added each member's JCNA number and is currently checking Dropbox for updated photos of our members. She should have it finished by the end of the week and will upload it to the SDJC website.
- As to the 2023 SDJC Membership and renewals -

April 2023 Memberships 144 Total Individuals 224 April 2022 Memberships 156 Total Individuals 250

To date we are down approximately 10% from this period in 2022. We have 135 Regular Memberships and 9 Associate Memberships (not reported to JCNA). Fifteen replied they will not renew because they moved, sold their Jaguar, were too busy or had passed. Thirty-one did not respond. She sent a snail mail letter advising them their membership is cancelled but encouraged them to renew and included a renewal form. At the close of 2022, SDJC had more members than JOCLA. SDJC had 164 and JOCLA had 153 members.

- The following items will be completed before the next meeting.
  - 2023 SDJC Membership Procedure update to add new policies and 15-month dues.
  - 2023 Membership Survey
  - Activities Guideline Update All guidelines need to be reviewed for needed updates.
  - Website She has several minor suggestions for the membership page which she will submit to Matt and Mark.
  - Also, she noticed the newly updated Bylaws need to be added to the website.
- Jaguar Tracks Newsletter Report: Chuck reported that he is working on the May-June issue. He has gathered lots of content and provided a list of content he still needs to produce a great issue of Jag Tracks once again.

- Webmaster Report: Matt reported that:
- On February 12, he had a training session with Mark Hodges to learn how the website functions. Also, he updated the event pictures including pictures from the recent San Vicente Golf Resort lunch event. He added event listings for the La Jolla Concours d'Elegance, AGM, and the IJF. For the JOCLA Mission Inn Drive, which was postponed, he sent a cancellation eblast to all registered attendees, added a cancellation note to the website, and then added the rescheduled event for April 1. He made a few website clean-ups and fixed a couple of broken links. The website is now up to date.
- For April, he updated the Event photos, added the Rolling British Car Day to the events page, added the Southwest Regional Judges training to the events page, created a digital version of the 2023 JCNA Concours Judges test, and updated the layout and names of the Tuchscher Award page.
- As to the website, Nedra suggested that we create a tutorial on how to use the website, how to log in, how to register for events, and all of the other various website functions. Matt will work on putting this together.

### • Director's Reports:

- a. Tim Bennett Tim suggested that the club should put together a member's survey or poll to get feedback on the various events including what type of events to have, where to have them, the cost of meals, etc. Mark stated that he has done a survey in the past. He and Matt will work on creating and sending out a new survey.
- b. Dave Putman Nothing further to report.
- c. Al Steele Nothing further to report.
- d. Terry Tilton Nothing to report.

### **Functional Chair Reports:**

- Advertising Sales in Jaguar Tracks Dan reported that all but one advertiser has paid.
- Auto Museum Terry reported that the museum has started refurbishing their library. Their current
  display is electrical vehicles. Completion of the expansion is 5 to 20 years at a cost of \$20 million. There
  are 10 tables left for their annual gala.
- San Diego British Car Club Council (SDBCCC) Dave Putnam reported the following:
  - The Rolling British Car Day is on Saturday, April 29, 2023 and the rally will end at the Menghini Winery in Julian, CA. The cost is \$20 per vehicle.
  - The San Diego British Car Day is on Sunday, August 13, 2023 at Coronado Tidelands Park.
- Concours Chair & Property Manager Mark reported that he has uploaded all the required forms to the Port except for the insurance as it is not due until May. Registration will open up Sunday. The only bill not paid is the portable restroom provider. Mark is preparing a PowerPoint slide show to train and assist future Concours chairs.

- Chief Judge Dave Allen reported that:
- For March, he received the hard copies of the 2023 Concours Rule Book, total cost including section dividers and shipping was \$170.53 for seven books (210 pages each). The club has excellent training material (most of which he inherited and includes material by Dick Cavicke, Paul Novak, and Pete Reith). He has updated the training material to reflect the 2023 rule book changes and added a couple of pages relevant to later model cars. He also incorporated formatting clean up from Mark Hodges review. He has been asked by Steve Kennedy (JCNA rule book editor) and Hal Kritzman (JCNA Judge Training lead) to provide the training charts for use at the JCNA Annual General Meeting (AGM) training seminar.

The Concours Schedule is already full for 2023.

- April 22 Southwest Regional Judges' Training School, virtual via Zoom
- May 6 Hands-on Judges' training will be at Nedra's home. Coffee and pastries will be served upon arrival and a light lunch after the training is complete.
- June 4 JOCLA Concours at Huntington Central Park
- July 15 SDJC Concours at Spanish Landing
- September 30 Inland Empire Concours at Idyllwild
- October 1 Southwest Regional at Idyllwild
- October 30 International Jaguar Festival at Santa Barbara
- For April, that the near-term activities are the class training and hands-on training.
  - Southwest regional Judges Training School, virtual via Zoom on Saturday April 22
- Registration details are on the website. An eblast was sent to members and a separate email to existing judges. Although this training clashes with the La Jolla Concours, a makeup session will be available. Pete Rieth has already taken the training and the test. He is now certified to judge at the Mexico City Concours that takes place on the same weekend. Our Webmaster Matt has set up the JCNA concours test online, so the process is completely digital. No need to copy and scan. Great job Matt!
  - Hands-on-training at Nedra's home May 6 (Not yet on the website) -
- One of the best ways to train is to practice judging cars that are not 100% perfect. This enables the Judges to "calibrate" various defects. Dave's XJS V12 is perfect for this! He's driving it now so it's ready for the training. Each year there should be fewer items to spot.
  - Concours topics raised during the main session of the Annual General Meeting (AGM) -
- Here is an extract from Dave's AGM delegate report focusing on the Concours d'Elegance. Jim Sambolt, Concours Committee Chair, summarized the 2022 season. There were 35 Concours events. There were several areas where "we could do better" in terms of judging and administering the Concours. The list of improvements were all items covered by the rule book, which is both disappointing, but also reassuring that appropriate guidance is available. Dave's takeaway (as San Diego Chief Judge) was Chief Judges need to be more familiar with the rules, especially for Judge certification.

- Hal Kritzman, the JCNA Chief Judge, explained the rationale for the comprehensive Rule Book update for 2023. Basically, it is to improve consistency and remove ambiguity. Also shown was a glimpse of the new Chief Judge test. Only a couple of questions were shown, but the intention was to get a feeling from the AGM delegates whether the Chief Judge test was seen as a good idea. Unanimous support was shown, so Hal will continue to develop the test for use in 2024 onwards.
- Steve Kennedy, Concours Rule Book Editor, gave a brief overview of the recommended changes to 2023 Concours Rule Book. There are a total of 116 pages, most of which are clarifications with no real change to the rules. The changes were approved with a show of hands from the floor.
- There was a short discussion on the website interface for Chief Judges to upload scores. It was acknowledged to be "clunky" and does need improvement. One or two people offered useful tips to help speed up the process.
  - Breakout Session at Annual General Meeting (AGM) re: Concours & Rule Book –
- We discussed a JCNA Judge Training presentation, which was prepared originally by SDJC. We were recognized as a major contributor, with inputs from Dick Cavicke, Paul Novak, Pete Reith, Mark Hodges and Dave Allen.
- There were some enthusiastic discussions over rules, about update frequency, and if too many rules remove the fun. Ultimately it was agreed that rules are necessary to achieve the JCNA aim of consistent scoring across the country. One prolonged discussion was focused on red line tires, and if they should be considered eligible for Driven Class. They are non-authentic in Champion Class because they were never offered by Jaguar. The conclusion, after a long discussion, was they should be considered non-authentic in Driven Class also. Expect a rule change on this in the future.
- The group also discussed the best way to organize judging teams. It is actually a very complex exercise to match judge experience with the cars, while avoiding conflicts of interest (judging own car for example) and having an efficient judging schedule. Having done this myself, it is difficult. Fortunately, there is a software program to help and available via Janet Sowell at Pony Tech Solutions. We discussed the software and other ways to make the Concours easier to administer.
- **Dealer Representative** Jim Hallameyer No report.
- Historian Marie Allen reported that she has completed archiving about 90% of the club's history material into binders. She is currently up to 1996. In the material she was provided, the hard copy sources of history material have become scarce after around 1996, reflecting the move to the digital world. She will have a few folders available for display at the Members Luncheon next month. Once archiving is complete, we should discuss whether to continue using hard copy binders for more recent history or remain entirely online through the Jag Tracks. Nedra has 6 to 8 boxes of documents including past Jaguar Journals and Jag Tracks. It was agreed it would be too expensive to digitize these documents. We will put these documents into the club's storage unit.
- Raffles / Roster / Awards Nedra had nothing to report.
- Social media As this position is open, there was no report.

#### **Old Business:**

- As to Open positions: VP Activities and Social Media – We have not yet found anyone for VP Activities or Social Media but will continue to try to fill these positions. Nedra will try to post some of our upcoming events on social media.

#### **New Business:**

- As to the 2025 Annual General Meeting (AGM) - Nedra discussed the possibility of SDJC hosting the 2025 AGM. She knows that in the past it was decided it would be too costly and too much work. However, having attended five AGM's, she now has a better overview of what is needed, plus the requirements have changed to make it less complicated. She has investigated the total of sponsorship money from JCNA, as well as other sponsors. Tom Krefetz has reached out volunteering to be a sponsor and hold an event at Classic Showcase. Her objective is to see if this could be a money-making opportunity rather than a cost. Much has changed in the requirements from past years. Nedra will gather facts and figures and report back at the next meeting.

### **Adjournment / Next Meeting:**

The Meeting was adjourned at 8:00 pm.

The next board meeting is Wednesday, May 10, 2023, at 6:30 pm, via Zoom Video Conference.


