### **Presidential Perspective**

#### September - October 2023

As I noted last month, this is a busy time of year for SDJC. In reality, with our Southern California climate, this is the case pretty much year-round. The big event for July was the 59<sup>th</sup> SDJC Concours at Spanish Landing East on July 15. There was an excellent cross-section of Jaguars being judged or on display in beautiful weather. I detailed my "new" 2013 XK Coupe for judging in Champion Division, and was able to garner a trophy and gather a number of useful tips from the three judges of my car on how to improve my score in the future.



The first big event in August was British Car Day at Tidelands Park in Coronado on the 13<sup>th</sup>. Despite having lived in San Diego for over 50 years, I had never visited the park and I'm not sure I even recall hearing about it until the San Diego British Car Club Council (SDBCCC) announced this new location for the event several months ago. At the SDJC Board of Directors meeting the Wednesday preceding the gathering, our SDBCCC Representative and SDJC Director Dave Putnum said they had over 230 cars registered. Wow! He wondered how this many cars would be handled at the new setting. Well, with the efforts of Dave and other SDBCCC members and volunteers, both before and during the event (and likely afterward), it went very smoothly. Aston Martin was the featured marque and, per Dave, over 45 were on the grounds. There were also numerous Rolls Royce's, Bentleys, MGs, Triumphs, Land Rovers, and of course Jaguars, over 25 of us. The weather was terrific, and there was an abundance of space for cars, umbrellas, lounge chairs, etc. You can read the details starting on page 16.

The second big event for the month was the SDJC Concours Afterglow, held at the Rancho Santa Fe Golf Club on August 25. This great venue was again sponsored by Dave and Windley Putnam and family members. As in the past, the food was superb and those of us who were at the concours, and those that weren't, got to see a recap in the slides that were shown. 





Tom Krefetz, who won the Best of Show Award with his Gunmetal Gray 1938 SS100 OTS, received the special octagonal award trophy.







### San Diego British Car Day 2023

For this year's British Car Day, the Council decided to change the venue to the Tidelands Park on Coronado Island. This is a beautiful large park with views of the Coronado Bridge and the Navy shipyards in the background. The featured marque chosen for this year's event was Aston Martin, as it was their 110-year anniversary.



### Notes from the Concours Judge's Tent

## September - October 2023 By Dave Allen, Chief Judge, San Diego Jaguar Club



I don't know why Concours d'Elegance has a French sounding name - but it's very fitting for an automobile beauty pageant. Our club's 59<sup>th</sup> Concours was held July 15<sup>th</sup> at Spanish Landing Park. We had 46 cars on the field, 17 were judged and the 29 display entries made for a magnificent show of Jaguars along the edge of the park. Cars judged included an impressive selection of Jaguars through the ages, from Tom Krefetz's 1938 SS100 to Yory Campbell's 2019 F-Type SVR. Before recounting the events on the field, let's quickly recap the activities that led us here.

The preparations started months prior. Before entrants had even thought about preparing their cars, Mark Hodges had reserved the park and negotiated the terms with the Port Authority. Insurance coverage was arranged, reviewed and the early deposits to reserve the field were made in October of last year! There's a lot more that goes on behind the scenes, from arranging food trucks, organizing the trophies, etc.

Judges training started in April with a Southwest Regional Training School, with attendees from California, Arizona, Colorado and Oregon. The event is set up by the LA club, but the training material, which has been developed over the years by our Club, is presented by San Diego. We also attracted two brand new judges: Bridget Malcolm and Matt Allen!

Hands-on-training was held at Nedra's home in May. We had a good turnout and an exceptional number of great cars, with the opportunity to judge two XJ-Ss, XKR, XK, X-Type, S-Type R, two F-Pace, XJR and an XK140. The judges training was fun, but I suspect more than a few people were there for the incredible snacks and Nedra's outstanding hospitality!

There are four Concours d'Elegance in Southern California this year, with the LA Concours held at Huntington Beach in June. Concours #3 and 4 are at Idyllwild in late September. Four local Concours provide a great opportunity for enthusiasts to compete for National or regional trophies. An entrant who receives the highest average score over three Concours, anywhere in North America, is recognized by a 1<sup>st</sup> place National Award. It's for this reason the judging has to be accurate because scores from the different JCNA Concours are used to compare entries from across the Nation.

And now back to the San Diego Club 59<sup>th</sup> Concours d'Elegance: Setup on the day started early - we had crew arrive before 6:00 a.m. to set up tables, banners, canopies and transform the park into our personalized venue. Cars then started to arrive and were checked in by Mark Hodges and Terry Tilton. Parking guidance was provided by our many volunteers. Entrants were faced with an immediate choice: (1) polish the car, (2) go grab donuts and coffee, or (3) chat with friends / entrants / competitors. I had the XJS in display, so I had nothing to lose by grabbing donuts, coffee and a chat! I can't remember if we got around to polishing the XJS.

As Chief Judge I got busy with making sure the rule books were set out and available to the judging teams. I also had a keen interest in the entrants' arrivals to make sure the judges were available. Scheduling the judging teams is quite involved, so it was a relief to find that all judges were on the field and had reported for duty. Another "behind the scenes" activity is to review the entries for the special categories. Special categories include Preservation, and Modified cars. The Chief Judge is required to coordinate with the entrant to ensure the car is eligible, which for Preservation is absolute originality, with only maintenance activities allowed. Modified entries are required to have irreversible and significant modifications which are equivalent to 40+ points in Championship. There were no Preservation entries this year, but there was a stunning E-Type modified for racing in Class C2 - Modified. Tom Krefetz' entry truly embraced the Modified class, and a fabulous custom E-Type was the result. It has hundreds of points of modification, all identified ahead of the Concours and verified on the field before judging starts. It's a privilege to review works of art like that!

From my perspective, the Concours ran smoothly. The freshly restored 1961 E-Type entered by Glenn Chapin was a fabulous entry, and interesting to judge because at the time the E-Types were hand-made with many changes at the factory occurring at the time. The beautiful 1938 SS100 entered by Tom Krefetz was another entry to challenge the judges. It's hard to believe the car is 85 years old and looking absolutely gorgeous! Jumping forwards 69 years, we had another special entry: Steve Quilty brought his very rare X-Type Sportwagon all the way from Virginia! Steve aims to compete at every JCNA Concours with his very rare car! Immediately after this Concours he headed North via Seattle for the Concours at Victoria, British Columbia!

As well as the seasoned entrants, new for this year was Yory Campbell with a spectacular F-Type SVR in Santorini black. This was an ultra-modern F-Type with carbon fiber accents, including a carbon fiber roof! Dan Jensen brought his new 2013 XK Coupe in beautiful Carnelian Red Metallic, and Bill and Julie Wainer brought their 2011 XKR Coupe in Salsa Red (1 of 18 ultra-rare Poltrona Frau Special Editions).

There were five entries from Los Angeles: Jim Friel with an XK Convertible, Eric Gruver also with an XK Convertible, Mark Mayuga with a XJ-S Rouge Special Edition, Keith Webb with his XK140, and Domenic Valvano with his V12 E-Type. These cars were prepared to an extremely high standard and most won National awards in 2022! Judged entries from SDJC included Jan Daniel's E-Type, Mike Loper's XK140, Hal Michaels' XX150S, Kathleen Steele's S-Type R, and Will Nighswonger's XKR Convertible. Again, these are all spectacular cars and also represented a fabulous range of Jaguar style through the ages.

As Chief Judge, I focused on the Judged entries, but I noticed the spectacular cars in the Display category, and several could do well as judged entries in the Concours! Display entries spanned seven decades and included two futuristic Electric I-Pace, which generated a lot of interest. Two new members attend their first event by bringing their cars for display: Tyler Stolzenberg brought his XJS Convertible in black, and Alex Pavlov with his XJ8 Vanden Plas in Emerald Green.

Judging the Concours went well. The scores were very high, reflecting the excellent preparation by the entrants. Kathleen Steele and Matt Allen did an outstanding job as score sheet runners. Their role was to quickly scan the scoresheets for errors and pass the sheets to the score keepers. Celia Hunter and Marie Allen then processed the score sheets to establish the provisional scores and rankings.

Our judges were from San Diego, LA and Inland Empire, and a big thank you to all!







### CARSCOOPS Report

### Reborn Jaguar Will Target U.S. Millionaires, Feature 'Shock' Designs

JLR design boss Gerry McGovern said Jag brand currently had "no equity whatsoever" and that chasing volume had led to mediocrity.




Jaguar wants to bounce back from "mediocrity" and it will do it by targeting rich American buyers with polarizing designs. That's according to comments made to investors by JLR's boss last month.

In a frank discussion about the huge challenge facing the storied but struggling brand, new Jaguar Land Rover CEO Adrian Mardell and design chief Gerry McGovern recalled how Jaguar had been successful in the 1990s, particularly in North America, when its cars were more expensive and targeted a wealthier demographic than the brand has been chasing for the past 20 years.

"There are 20 million millionaires in the U.S. alone," *Auto News Europe* reports Mardell saying. "So, a lower volume, higher price positioning is absolutely the right position for Jaguar today."

But JLR chiefs conceded that the brand's strategy of chasing volume during the previous two decades, first under Ford, and then Tata, meant it had lost touch with the wealthy car buying community. While Mardell diplomatically admitted that "it's reasonable to assume there is a lot of work to build that brand equity," McGovern was more forthright in his assessment, and about the need for "fearless" designs conceived to shock and reengage the wealthy.



"What we will not worry about is being loved by everybody, because that is the kiss of death," *Auto News Europe* reports McGovern saying of the polarizing new designs heading our way from Jag. "That is what put Jaguar in the situation it is in today, which is with no equity whatsoever."

Later this year Jaguar will reveal the first of three all-electric vehicles, a four-door GT with a range of up to 430 miles (700 km) that will be in showrooms in 2025 priced from around \$125,000. Two more EVs will follow, both built from the same new JEA (Jaguar Electric Architecture) platform, and we've got money on at least one of them chasing Bentley's audience, while a crossover of some kind also seems likely.

#### Tim Bennett sends this report on some huge Auction Action!

A 1957 Jaguar XKSS was sold last week by RM Sotheby's at its auction coinciding with 2023 Monterey Car Week.

After some intensive bidding, the car finally sold for \$13,205,000, which was right in the center of its estimate of between \$12 million and \$14 million.

The car, which bears chassis no. 707, is among the best preserved examples of the Jaguar race car built for the road. It features most of its original bodywork, plus an original engine block and head, and even two of the three carburetors, according to the auction listing. The odometer shows 25,535 miles, which is thought to be the actual lifetime mileage.

The original XKSS cars were D-Type race cars converted for road use and sold to customers mostly in the U.S., one of them being Steve McQueen. After winning Le Mans with the D-Type two years in a row, Jaguar chose to withdraw from racing at the end of the 1956 season. That left some spare D-Type chassis.



Chassis no. 707 was one of the original 16 cars to be built. It was imported to the U.S. originally for delivery to racing driver Lou Brero Sr., who selected a cream exterior and red interior. He died in a crash before taking delivery and as a result the car was sold to dealer Sammy Weiss, whose Sacramento dealership sold it to San Francisco resident and racer Sidney Colberg in 1960.

Colberg kept the XKSS for 15 years before selling it to British enthusiast Anthony Bamford. The car then remined in the U.K., trading hands a few times. Over the years, the original hood, dented in racing incidents, was replaced, as well as a rear bulkhead due to the original featuring holes once cut for roll bars. The car was also repainted at one point to its current metallic blue—a nod to the Ecurie Ecosse race cars.

### Jaguar Land Rover Will Build \$5 Billion UK Battery Plant

With a flush investment from Indian parent company Tata Group, JLR is speeding up its fully electrified journey.



- The United Kingdom is gaining back some of its former automotive manufacturing prowess, as Jaguar Land Rover announces a \$5 billion investment in battery production.
- With funds coming from the Tata Group, JLR's parent company, British officials say this new facility will also help the UK achieve its 2030 emissions and EV sales goals.
- Battery production won't start until 2026, but JLR says we can expect an all-electric Range Rover and new GT-style, Jaguar EV by 2025.

Luxury brands like Maserati and Jaguar Land Rover aren't diving into the electrification race as fast as traditional automakers and it might be for a good reason. With smaller customer bases and higher production costs, adding electrified powertrains to the mix represents increasing costs in the worried minds of company executives. But that doesn't mean luxury automakers are immune to the various government mandates surrounding electrification in the 21st century.

Which is why most luxury manufacturers (save for EV-specific luxury startups like Rivian and Lucid) are dipping their toes into the electric waters with plug-in hybrids or select BEV offerings. And Jaguar Land Rover is no exception to this rule, with the oddball Jaguar I-Pace and a few plug-in hybrid and mild hybrid Range Rover models. But the UK-based brand is readying itself for a big change, as JLR parent company Tata Group announces a \$5 billion investment in a UK battery gigafactory.

The plant is important for several reasons, namely signifying a reified interest in the United Kingdom as an automotive hub but also marking Tata's first gigafactory away from its home base in India. Around 4000 new employees of JLR, which was acquired by Tata in 2008, will operate the plant as it works toward an annual output of 40 gigawatt-hours. And the plant will be built in Somerset, nearby JLR's current assembly facilities in Birmingham, with an estimated production start date of 2026.

With earlier claims from Jaguar Land Rover CEO Thierry Bolloré setting up Jaguar for a fully electric lineup and Land Rover offering five BEVs by 2025, industry experts have shared skepticism about the likelihood of these claims, but JLR has yet to back down from its stance. In fact, the English automaker doubled down earlier this year, saying it would invest \$19.3 billion over the next five years in a push for complete carbon neutrality by 2039. JLR also says it's aiming to eliminate tailpipe emissions by 2036.

While the new battery facility is planned for an annual output of 40 gigawatt-hours, British officials say this investment will provide almost half of the battery production needed for its 2030 net zero-emissions goals. Facing competition from both the US and neighboring EU countries like Germany and Spain, the UK hasn't always appeared as welcoming to such gigafactories (save for the middling Nissan facility in Sunderland) due to lacking subsidies. But British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak as well as Investment Minister Dominic Johnson concurred the deal will be massively important for the nation's economy, according to the BBC.

"Hopefully we're going to be returning to our peak level car production over the next five to 10 years," Johnson said in an interview with Reuters. "As soon as it got out that we may be in the running to win this amazing investment, we started to get some quite interesting inquiries from other companies."



And since we're on the subject of batteries, Pete Rieth brings us this sidebar:

Q: What are those white Jaguars with sensors driving around L.A.? A: The \$70,000 SUVs wearing a giant baseball cap of gizmos belong to Waymo, the autonomous-car company launched by Google in 2009. Since October, they have been running test drives with routes taking them through downtown, Westwood, and Koreatown. Once they get DMV approval, the electric Jags will become driverless alternatives to Uber and Lyft, with similar prices, no tips, and no attitude. "I've had drivers tell me they won't go to certain areas," says Waymo's Olivia Chang. "The Waymo driver doesn't care. We'll be in all neighborhoods, from Beverly Hills to San Pedro."

And finally, to closeout this month's Editor ramblings, I bring you the picture below. **Will Nighswonger** and I attended the San Marino Concours d'Elegance this past Sunday. Wow, over 450 cars and approximately 150 Judges, of which Will was one of them. I had a great time! Walking back to the car after the event we spotted this. Looks like this Jaguar owner isn't going to have such a great afternoon.



### **SDJC Board of Directors Meeting Minutes**

### James Waite July 12, 2023

### **Call to Order / Attendance:**

The Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm via Zoom Video Conference by the Club President.

The officers present were Dan Jensen, President; Nedra Rummell, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Membership; Dave Allen, Treasurer & Chief Judge; James Waite, Secretary; Chuck Leuthen, Newsletter Editor; Matt Allen, Webmaster; Al Steele, Director; Dave Putnam, Director; Terry Tilton, Director & Auto Museum Representative; Marie Allen, Historian; and Mark Hodges, Concours Chair & Property Manager.

### **Board Reports:**

- **Secretary's Report**: James reported that the Minutes of the June 14, 2023 meeting were approved electronically. The Minutes were forwarded to Chuck for inclusion in the newsletter.
- Treasurer's Report: Dave Allen reported the following:
- For June, the month activities include income of \$1,613.00 comprising \$70.00 received for Club Dues, \$443.00 for Classified Ads and \$1,100 for Concours Registration. Expenses for June were \$821.91, Bank fees (\$51.90), JCNA dues (\$80.00), Concours trophies (\$308.72), Parking for Concours support vehicles (\$48.00), long speaker cables for the sound system (\$114.99) Monthly storage facility fees (\$144.00), and website (\$74.30). The later expense includes an annual \$70.00 fee for a SSL certificate that authenticates a website's identity and enables an encrypted connection. Overall, the club had a net income of \$791.09 for the month mostly due to registrations for the Concours d'Elegance. Club finances remain healthy.
- July insight: The last registrations are coming in for the Concours d'Elegance.
- The action from last month was to look at earning interest on the Clubs bank balance. Dave's research shows a 13-month CD earns 4.5% with Bank of America. Longer terms earn less. Dave asked the board if want him to deposit say \$10k in a 13-month CD. The amount and terms were discussed and also whether to deposit money into a money market account compared to a certificate of deposit. Dave will look into these other options so as to maintain liquidity and availability of the funds. The topic was tabled for discussion at the August BOD meeting.

### **Board Reports:**

- **Secretary's Report**: James reported that the Minutes of the July 12, 2023 meeting were approved electronically. The Minutes were forwarded to Chuck for inclusion in the newsletter.
- Treasurer's Report: Dave Allen reported the following:
- For July, the income was \$1,684.00 comprising \$300.00 received for Club Dues, \$443.00 for Classified Ads, \$220 for Concours Registration, and \$651.00 for Concours Afterglow registrations. The expenses were \$846.51 comprising Bank fees (\$52.43), JCNA dues (\$160.00), Concours supplies (\$202.23), coffee & donuts at the Concours (\$125.70), office supplies (\$13.20), monthly storage (\$288.00) which was a double payment, with no charge in August and the monthly payment for the domain name email accounts (\$4.95). Overall, we had a net income of \$837.49 for the month mostly due to registrations for the Afterglow Luncheon. The Club's finances remain healthy.
